

UINTAH CITY COUNCIL MEETING TUESDAY, OCTOBER 18TH, 2022 7:00 PM MINUTES

1. MEETING CALL TO ORDER: Meeting called to order by Mayor Cutler at 7:00 p.m.

3. APPROVAL OF CITY COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES HELD OCTOBER 4, 2022:

- Present City Council Members reviewed the minutes from October 4, 2022.
- Council Member Bell motioned to approve the City Council Meeting minutes for October 4, 2022.
- · Council Member Smith seconded the motion.

4. TREASURERS REPORT:

- a) Invoice Register September 2022
 - Council Member Bell made the motion to approve the bank card list for September 2022

b) Budget

Mr. Ulrich explained that the numbers on the budget that was sent out were doubled, so he will fix that. The
figures that he submitted to the state were correct. After skimming through the budget and there was
nothing that stood out. He had a follow up from last month on a payment from Cory Nielson where the judge
ordered a refund. The payment was made twice which is why there was a refund issued.

5. DISCUSSION/ACTION ON THE REPLACEMENT OF THE FURNACE AT THE SCOUT HOUSE:

- Council Member Boothe mentioned that we have an additional bid besides the ones from last meeting. There are two
 bids from Comfort Systems, one from Deseret Edge Heating and Comfort Systems, and the last one is from Dick
 Kearsley Comfort Network. After reviewing the bids, they basically all have the same warranty and installation
 information. He was impressed with the quotes from Deseret Edge Heating and Comfort Systems. Council Member
 Smith mentioned that the quote from Deseret Edge includes a 10-year warranty.
- Council Member Boothe proposed that we approve the quote from Deseret Edge Heating and Cooling for \$3,390 for the furnace at the scout house.
- Motion was seconded by Council Member Roberts.

6. <u>DISCUSSION/ACTION ON A BUILDING MORATORIUM EXTENSION ORDINANCE NO. 273-22:</u>

Presenter: Kristi Bell

• Council Member Bell explained that every six months we are evaluating the situation on the building moratorium. Her recommendation is to extend this for six more months as the process for building the water tanks progresses. By November of next year, the tanks will be done. There is a pre-construction meeting next week for the water tanks and she will have a better idea of what their plans are after that meeting. If we extend the moratorium another six months, it will give them a jump start on the project and at that time we can re-evaluate and see where the project is at. Another reason for the moratorium is because we don't have adequate water storage for the people in our City.

Mayor Cutler mentioned stated that I would plan on six months after this one expires in case there is a hiccup along the line.

- Council Member Bell proposed that we approve Ordinance 273-22 extending the building moratorium for six more months.

8. SHERIFF'S REPORT:

Presenter: Lt. Ryan

• Lt. Ryan explained that for the month of September the sheriff's office had 89 calls for service. Out of the 89 calls, 45 were traffic stops. Our traffic unit has been doing a really good job. Out of those calls for service, 18 resulted in citations. It shows 2 animal complaints, although he was only able to find one. The other call that caught his eye was a man that made a wrong turn onto the railroad tracks causing the tracks to have to be shut down until they were able to remove the vehicle. We have had a speed trailer set up on 6600, so the traffic unit is aware when they need to watch traffic this way. Council thanked Lt. Ryan for all he does.
