CITY COUNCILOR BELL

WELCOME

We have two fresh faces working in the city and would like to welcome Broc and Michelle to Uintah. They both bring years of experience in various areas that will benefit our city for years to come. We are excited to have you join our team.

CULINARY WATER

As a city, we purchase 468 Acre feet of water for the entire year. Due to drought conditions, we have been reduced to 283 Acre feet of water. If we exceed that number, we face steep fines as a city. We are asking for your help; we can't meet this number without everyone doing their part to reduce water use. For conservation tips and weekly watering guide visit: www.conservewater.utah.gov

CURRENT DROUGHT RESTRICTIONS:

- 60% reduction in water available for outdoor irrigation of lawns and gardens (both culinary and secondary)
- 40% reduction for agricultural use
- 10% reduction for culinary indoor use.
- Limit outdoor watering to once a week. (20 minutes per station)
- No watering between 10am & 6pm

In last month's newsletter, the need for additional water conservation and rate tier change was discussed. Thank you to those who reached out to voice your support of changing the structure to encourage water conservation within Uintah. I would like to move forward with introducing a two-tier system – one for winter/regular summers and one for extreme summer drought conditions- as soon as possible. Please watch the council agenda if you wish to attend.


UDAYS *****JUNE 10TH & 11TH*****
