



From the Mayor's Desk

Last month, I wrote about my conquest to have the rail road approve the city's request to have a walking path or shoulder along 6600 South. In this same article, I requested feedback regarding the project. To my surprise, I received several emails, calls, text and people seeking me out to give their support for the project. There were a few emails outlining some concerns, but I think these concerns can easily be solved.

After many conversations with the rail road this past month, the rail road finally granted permission to widen 6600 S to allow for a walking path or shoulder on the south side of the road with the caveat of a 25' buffer from the road to the rail. Now that the hardest hurdle has been overcome, the next hurdle will be to work with Weber County Transportation Committee and Weber Pathways to find funding for this project, which may take several months, and possible up to a year. To prepare for this eventuality, I petitioned the Weber Area Council of Governments (WACOG) members to appoint me to the WACOG Transportation Committee, which I have served on for the last 2 years. The time spent on this committee has helped me understand the criteria necessary to be awarded funding for a project of this magnitude. To give us additional support and direction, Weber Pathways has agreed to help us find additional money and support to complete this very large project.

This project is moving in the right direction and appropriate steps have been taken to ensure a successful completion of the project. As the project moves along, I will keep you posted.

With the departure of Chief Pope came the appointment of our new Fire Chief, who happens to be our current Deputy Chief Marc Sacco. Chief Sacco was sworn in on February 20, 2018. Sacco hails from Wheeling, West Virginia and has twenty-five years in the fire service. Beginning his career as a volunteer firefighter himself in Niceville, Florida. Locally he has worked for South Ogden and Sunset Fire Department's before coming to Uintah in 2014 where he has held the positions of Captain, Battalion Chief, Fire Marshal and Deputy Chief. He also holds the following degrees; A.S. in Aerospace Science – Community College of the Air Force, A.S. in Fire Science (w/ Honors) – American Military University, and 115 of 122 credits completed towards B.A. in Emergency & Disaster Management – American Military University. His certifications are; Firefighter I/II, HazMat Awareness, Operations and Technician, ADO/Pumper, Fire Instructor I, Fire Inspector I, Fire Investigator, Advanced EMT, EMS Instructor, EMS Training Officer and Course Coordinator

When asked why he chose Uintah? Sacco said, "My wife and I chose to move to the area so that we could continue to serve the Uintah community for many years to come and the potential of this fire department is astounding. All members of the department are amazing individuals for volunteering their precious time for nearly zero pay to serve our community. Company Officers are excellent supervisors and the Chief Officers are tremendous mentors. Each member truly cares about serving the community. Additionally, the training opportunities at UCFD are far greater than any other department I have served with in my career and the feel of the department is more like a family than a volunteer service."

Outside the fire department, Sacco works as a Radar Systems Analyst/Technical Advisor at Hill AFB. He is also Retired U.S. Air Force Master Sergeant. Outside work, Chief Sacco and his family enjoy motorcycling, snowboarding, RV camping when time/opportunity allows, firefighting, and furthering the professional educating of our firefighters.

Chief Sacco resides in the Uintah Highlands with his wife Donna Sacco who is a UCFD Fire Captain. They have four children Jazmyne Sacco, Dakotah Sacco, Ashley Murguia and Phillip Linson. He also has 4 grandchildren.
