**2-1-1:** As we begin the cold winter months where heating is crucial, I'd like to pass along a resource for any who might need it. 2-1-1 provides people with ways to get help, and give help. By simply dialing 2-1-1, callers can connect to the health and human resources they need, as well as find meaningful volunteer opportunities.

**What is 2-1-1?** 2-1-1 is an easy-to-remember, three-digit number that connects people to the services they need, such as housing and utility assistance, food resources, legal aid, and more. 211 is:

- Free, confidential, and for everyone
- The number to call to give help and to get help
- An invaluable resource in the aftermath of a disaster
- A simple way to find the assistance you need from organizations throughout Utah

Sometimes, Google isn't enough. For times when you don't know what to do, who to call, or even what to ask, dial 2-1-1.

## Uintah City Elections

This year, registered voters will receive their ballot in the mail. The by-mail ballot should arrive the week of October 21. Ballots may be returned by mail or dropped in a ballot drop-box. There is a drop-box located at the Uintah City office. There are also drop-boxes at all Weber County libraries and Weber State University.

You can also vote in person on Election Day, November 5. Early voting will be held at the Weber County Elections Office from Wednesday October 30, through Monday, November 4 during regular business hours. This year, "I Voted" stickers are included with the mailed ballots.
