The road construction company that was selected to perform the work has delayed the start date several times and we have reached the point of uncertainty of when the overlay and slurry seal will occur. Recently, we have been told the overlay on 1650 and 1540 will begin on September 28th; However, due to recent events with this company, this date may change. If this date changes again, you will be notified via the newsletter or door hanger notice provided by the construction company. If you live on either of these streets, please do not park on the road. Traffic Light

The traffic light on HWY 89 and 6600 South has transformed getting in and out of the City from a harrowing adventure to a much more safe and tranquil experience. The sharp corner and the required 25 mph speed limit also made a change with a different safety concern. This is especially true for vehicles eastbound approaching HWY 89 and the transition from 40 mph to 25 mph.


Over several weeks, the Weber County Sheriff's Office did a traffic study on 6600 South. The study, conducted at all different times of the day and night, found that "traffic traveling east bound **did not slow down** to the 25 mph posted speed limit prior to the curves." The average speed for vehicles entering the curves east bound was 43 mph. To make 6600 South at the curves safer for everyone using this part of the road including the residence, the businesses on Bell Lane and the Fire Department vehicles entering and exiting, they made the following recommendation:

Move the 25 mph sign further west on 6600 South to give drivers traveling east bound more time to slow down prior to hitting the curves.

Be advised that the east bound 25 mph zone will be moved further to the west prior to the 2275 East intersection and railroad crossing.

I wanted everyone to have advance knowledge of this change. Please be alert and adjust your speed accordingly.

A Word from Your City Fire Marshal

I drive the city on an almost daily basis and have seen quite a few homeowners taking care of their weeds. This is very appreciated from a fire mitigation standpoint. However, there are some lots that still need attention as to their weed grown of more than six inches. Keep in mind as a home/lot owner, you are responsible for the property up to the road or lot line, including irrigation ditches and fence lines. Any open lot,

pasture, coral or unused area of your property is still the responsibility of the property owner. This is where I am finding the excessive weed growth. Please take care of these areas in a timely manner.

During September, I will be personally making contact with home/lot owners to see what we can do to help.

If you find that you just cannot mitigate your weed issues, notify the Uintah City Fire Prevention Bureau and we will see what we can do to assist you.

The City of Uintah is a beautiful, unique, somewhat rural place to live. Our job is to keep it safe, assist our neighbors, keep it beautiful and most of all, protect the lives and property of our residents as best we can. We can only do this with your help. Let's work together to keep our city safe and pristine.
