I promise you'll love meeting active military members, as well as veterans, and hearing about their stories. We're also working hard on getting sponsors for this challenge and display. I'm also happy to visit your show or guild meeting to do a presentation about this challenge, time permitting.

A Quilt Challenge and Traveling Display Celebrating 100 Years of Naval Aviation

You are invited to participate in a special quilt challenge celebrating the Centennial of Naval Aviation!

About the Challenge:

We are asking quilt makers from around the country to make a quilt honoring 100 years of Naval Aviation (Navy, Marines and Coast Guard). There are a few rules and requirements, but the most important ones are that the quilt be 40" square, and must be related to naval aviation.

No specific fabric is required. There will also be a group quilt category.

About the Display:

CONA (the Centennial of Naval Aviation Committee) is planning celebrations in most states during 2011. The Blue Angels will be performing in air shows in over 30 states, and there will be other events such as Fleet Weeks and naval related conventions and exhibitions. Selected quilts will be displayed at as many of these events as possible, potentially being viewed by hundreds of thousands of attendees. Additional quilts will travel to naval and other military museums and celebrations, as well as quilt shows and exhibitions across the nation.

This quilt display could potentially be seen by more viewers than any quilt display in history.

All quilts entered have the option to be donated to a special auction for the National Flight Academy, an education project of the Naval Aviation Museum Foundation. The National Flight Academy is poised to become the premiere aviation-inspired learning adventure for our Nation's youth, delivering a world-class experience that ignites students' passion for Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM). The curriculum will be based on these STEM principles designed to help prepare 7th-12th graders to compete in the challenging technological future. Attendees will spend 5 ½ days in an immersive, aviation-based learning environment reaching beyond the traditional academic experience. The deadline for the online quilt submission will be Oct. 1st, 2010. The award winning and all selected traveling quilts will debut at the Blue Angel Homecoming Air Show November 11th and 12th, 2010 in Pensacola, FL at the National Naval Aviation Museum. Kick-off naval events for CONA will (tentatively) start in San Diego and Washington DC in Jan., 2011. Quilts not donated will be returned in January, 2012.



The Centennial of Naval Aviation quilt challenge will not be possible without the generosity of sponsors, volunteers and quilters from around the country.

Quilter Friendly Recipe

With so much snow covering the nation the last few weeks, we've been enjoying a lot of soup. Here's an easy, fast and healthy recipe that will please your quilt friends or your family!

Cheese and Veggie Potato Soup



- 4 cups chicken broth
- 2 cups chopped, peeled potato
- 1 cup chopped celery
- 1 cup chopped green or red sweet pepper (or substitute mixed frozen vegaies)
- 4 cups skim milk
- 8 Tbsp all purpose flour
- 1 cup shredded cheese
- 1/4 tsp ground nutmeg


In saucepan, combine broth and veggies. Bring to boil, reduce heat, cover and simmer for 10-12 minutes. In small bowl, stir together milk and flour, stir into saucepan. Cook and stir until thickened and bubbly. Stir in cheese until melted, then add nutmeg.

Each bowl has fewer than 100 calories, and the total prep time is under 30 minutes.





I recently participated in an invitation display called "Quilting Makes a Difference" sponsored by the Road to California show in Ontario, CA. Approximately 30 quilters were given the same 30" block to quilt in our usual style. Here's a sneak preview of my quilt.
