Notes from Jukebox

Big, Big, Big news around here! We've recently purchased a building in old town Fort Collins, and will be moving in after some remodelling work, probably around April 1st. You won't need to wait that long, though, to check it out. Angela, owner of Moma Said Sew, is moving her delightful quilt shop in and plans on opening March 4th. The building is the Art Center of Fort Collins, otherwise known as the Poudre River Arts Building on the northeast corner of College and Willow. Angela will be in 406 N. College, and we'll be directly upstairs. The building also houses The Center for Fine Arts Photography (400 N. College); Ideas Happen Here, an art school for children; The Open Stage Theater and Company offices; and The Glass Umbrella, a really cool glass shop and school owned by talented artists Karen Cannon, Mary Barron and Anne Meier Davis (all in 402 N. College). We've always wanted to have a wonderful, collaborative and creative space with like-minded owners of other shops, and now we have it! We'll keep you posted about classes and other events by all the artistic businesses in this building. This summer, we may have an available storefront - if you know of anyone looking, have them call us!

So, what will this mean for our customers? There's great parking without time restrictions, and we're within walking distance of about a zillion awesome restaurants and fun shops. It's less than a block to the Poudre River Trail, so bring your bikes (or check one out from the FC Bike Library). Fort Collins has the reputation of being the Napa Valley of Micro Breweries, so within a few blocks you'll find New Belgium and other great breweries and hard cideries to visit, if you so desire. Here's a hilarious thought: after quilting for awhile, rent this Septacycle with a group of friends or your family, and enjoy riding around the area! Check out their video - you'll have no choice but to laugh. The new Discovery Museum is also just across the street. We're straddling two of Fort Collins' districts - the Art District and now with the Engines and Energy Conversion Laboratory next door that is creating a new "Innovation Corridor," I think we're in a pretty spectacular spot! Sorta like the Walgreen's commercial- only we're on the corner of "Inspiration and Innovation." Ideas and creativity abound!

We'll have our machine showroom there, will be doing all customer training, and will have our very popular machine rental business at this new location, so bring in a quilt and give one of our Gammill machines a spin. Our current shop will be used for machine staging, storage and manufacturing, and occasional "messy" classes like Ayn's dyeing class (see below). We'll look forward to having you visit us in our new space!

We quilt or allow our machines to be used for hundreds of charity quilts each year. If we have a machine and staffing available, there is no charge for you to quilt a charity quilt, as long as you are clear about the plan for the quilt when you book time, and are willing to provide complete details about the organization receiving the quilt. Sat. Feb. 22 9:30-12 It's All About the Quilting!

I'm giving this lecturing at the Feb. CQC meeting in Westminster.

Great quilts are achieved when every step of the quiltmaking process is designed and executed in a cohesive fashion. So many quilts are wonderfully constructed to the point of a finished quilt top, but then things begin to go "wrong" as unrelated quilting is chosen to hold the three layers together. We'll discuss a wide variety of quilts and talk about how to effectively choose, design, and complete the best quilting (or how to communicate your desires to your longarm quilter). I will talk a lot about the judging process, and what judges consider essential in award winning quilts in terms of the quilting. This presentation will be a combination of slides and a trunk show. You may want to bring a notebook and pencil for note taking. Guild members are also encouraged to bring quilts and quilt tops to show, inspire others, or to ask questions about planning the right quilting time permitting. Part of the presentation will include information about batting, threads, and other supplies and techniques, but primarily this talk will be about how to fill space and to end up with a quilt that you'll be thrilled with!
