## MULTI-SIZE QUILT PATTERN

## PATTERN NOTES

- $8^{\prime \prime} \times 8^{\prime \prime}$ finished block after sewn in quilt.
- Use $1 / 4$ " seam allowance throughout.
- WOF: Width of Fabric selvage to selvage is assumed to be 40".
- Press seams in direction of arrows.
- Please read all the directions before beginning.


## Before you start!

Do a seam allowance test: Use pieces cut from scraps to test your seams before beginning to ensure your block measures the right size.

Cut (2) pieces of fabric: $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 4 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$. With right sides together, sew along the $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ side. Open and press. Your piece should measure $41 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$. If it doesn't, adjust your seam allowance until it does. Mark the place on your sewing machine (or take note of your settings), so you achieve this same seam allowance throughout the quilt.

Make a test block: I suggest you make one of each block before cutting up all your fabric. Your block should measure 81/2" $\times 81 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ before sewn into the quilt.

## CUTTING

Cut the following number of strips by width of fabric, then subcut into squares or rectangles as instructed for your desired quilt size. Borders will be cut on page 6.

| Prints | 21/2" strips | 9 | 24 | 38 | 54 |
|  | Subcut into $2^{11 / 2 "} \times 411 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ | 48 | 128 | 200 | 288 |
|  | Subcut into $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ | 48 | 124 | 196 | 288 |
|  |  |  |  |  |  |
| Light background | 21/2" strips | 12 | 32 | 50 | 72 |
|  | Subcut into $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ | 96 | 252 | 396 | 576 |

## BLOCK ASSEMBLY

Lay out all the pieces needed to construct each block as shown in the diagram below, paying attention to the direction that each seam is pressed.

## Block A

Light background: (4) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
Prints: (4) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 4 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$

- Sew side pieces together end to end.

- Sew center pieces together and attach side units to center.



## Block B

Light background: (4) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 412^{\prime \prime}$

Prints: (4) $2 \frac{1}{2 \prime} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 2 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$
Black: (4) $21 / 22^{\prime \prime} \times 21 / 22^{\prime \prime}$


- Sew top and bottom (3) units together.
- Sew center 4-patch together then add side rectangles.
- Sew rows together.


## QUILT ASSEMBLY

Sew the blocks into rows, alternating blocks A and B; then, sew the rows together. Press seams between blocks in one direction in odd-numbered rows. Press seams between blocks in opposite direction in evennumbered rows.

QUILT SIZE BREAKDOWN


## Borders

The length of strips needed to construct your borders depends on the actual size of your quilt. Measure your quilt after each step to ensure that your borders will be cut at correct size. For most efficient use of fabric, join all the strips for each border together end to end using a diagonal seam and subcut pieces to the desired length. Sew side borders on first and then top and bottom borders.

Black inner border is cut $2^{\prime \prime}$ wide. It finishes at $11 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ wide.

| Subcut 2 strips this long for sides | 481/2" | 721/2" | 881/2" | 961/2" |
| Subcut 2 strips this long for top and bottom | $351 / 2{ }^{\prime \prime}$ | 591⁄2" | 751/2" | 991⁄2" |

Teal outer border: Crib is cut $3^{11 / 4} 4^{\prime \prime}$ wide. It finishes at $3^{\prime \prime}$ wide. Twin, queen and king are cut $53 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ side. They finish at $51 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ wide.

| Subcut 2 strips this long for top and bottom | 41" | 70" | 86" | 110" |

Layer backing, batting and quilt top. Quilt and bind.

| Teal outer border | 1/2 yard | 13/4 yards | 13/4 yards | 2 yards |
| Backing | 23/4 yard 1 seam horizontally | $51 / 4$ yards 1 seam vertically | 8 yards 2 seams horizontally | 10 yards 2 seams horizontally |
| Binding | 1/2 yard | $3 / 4$ yard | 3/4 yard | 1 yard |
