



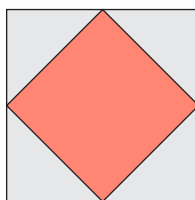

*In Part 2 of this project you will be making 16 square in a square units using the clipped corner technique. The instructions are written using the "draw a line" method, but there are several techniques to create the unit. Choose the one you prefer to create*



## PART 2

### CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS

From Fabric 1 cut:

4 strips 6 1/2" by the width of the fabric.

Cross cut these strips into 16 squares measuring 6 1/2".

From the Background Fabric cut:

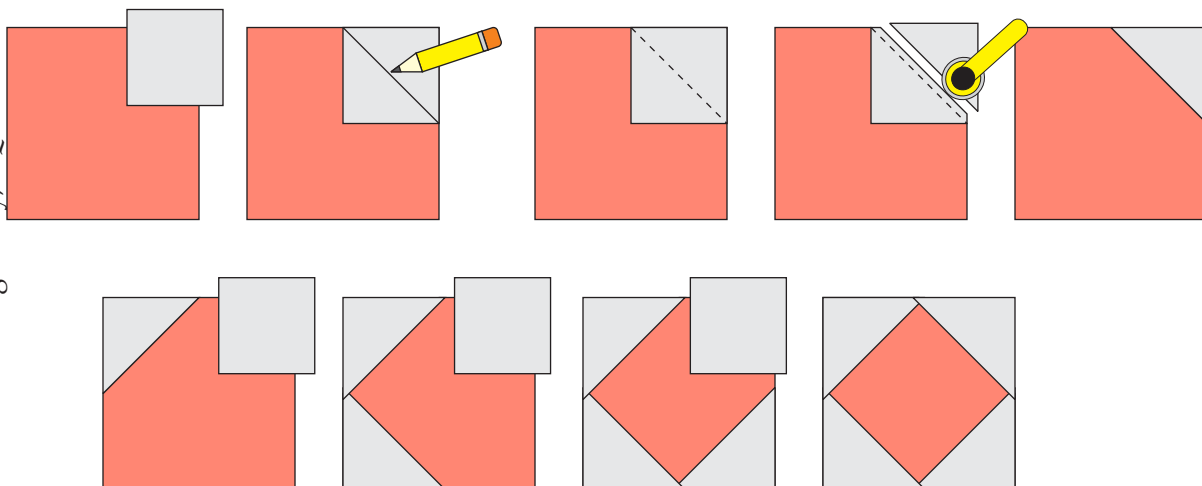
7 strips 3 1/2" wide by the width of the fabric. Cross cut these strips into 64 squares measuring 3 1/2".

### INSTRUCTIONS

1. Following the illustrations below :

- Place one square of background fabric in the top right corner of the Fabric 1 square, having the right sides together and the raw edges even.
- Draw a diagonal line on the background square in the direction shown in the illustrations below.
- Stitch directly on the line you have drawn.
- Trim, leaving 1/4" seam allowance.
- Open and press the seam toward the corner triangle.

2. Rotate the clipped corner unit made in step one 90° and repeat the process on the top right corner. Continue rotating the unit until all four corners have triangles of background fabric added. Press the seam toward the corner triangles. Make 16 units.

## Instructions for using the Creative Grids Square on Square 6" Trim Tool

### CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS

#### From Fabric ONE cut:

2 Strips 4  $\frac{3}{4}$ " by the width of the fabric.  
Cross cut these in 16 squares 4  $\frac{3}{4}$ "

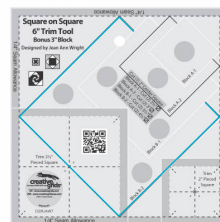
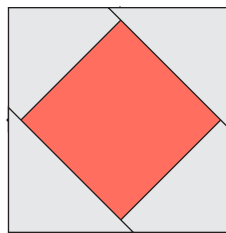
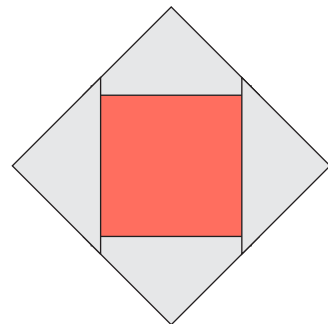
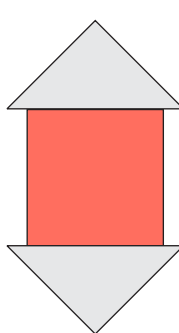
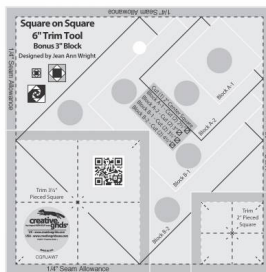
#### From the Background Fabric cut:

4 strips 4  $\frac{1}{2}$ " by the width of the fabric.  
Cross cut into 32 squares 4  $\frac{1}{2}$ ". Then cut each diagonally once to yield 64 triangles.

### INSTRUCTIONS

1. Center the long edge of a background triangle to the edge of a 4  $\frac{3}{4}$ " fabric ONE square. Stitch using  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam. Press toward the added triangle. Repeat for the opposing side. Add the remaining two triangles to the other two sides. Press.

2. Place the Creative Grids Trim Tool over the block unit - matching the square marked Block B-2 over the Fabric ONE square. These lines are highlighted in blue on the illustration. (Notice how the seam allowance is built into all four sides of the tool). Trim up one side and across the top. Rotate the partially trimmed unit  $\frac{1}{2}$  turn (180 degrees) then trim the remaining two sides.



## Blueberry Salsa

Serves 6

2 C. Blueberries  
1/2 of a yellow bell pepper, chopped.  
1/2 of a red bell pepper, chopped.  
1/4 C. of red onion, chopped.  
1 Jalapeno pepper, seeded and finely chopped.  
1/4 C. Cilantro, chopped.  
Juice of 2 small limes.  
1 tsp. Extra Virgin Olive Oil  
Salt & Pepper.  
Corn Chips for dipping.



In a large bowl combine all of the salsa ingredients. Season with salt and pepper to taste. Serve with corn chips or your favorite cracker. Refrigerate leftovers.
