Uses 2½" strips — perfect for precuts!



Madison's Star

This dynamic Lonestar is a version of a bargello, filling up the space, in this case, the diamonds, with the movement of color. It is made easy to put together by using 2½" strips and can be done in a guilter's weekend! Choose your strip set and background fabric, reserve your choices on setting and borders until you have your diamonds pieced. The only seam you'll have to match up in each diamond is the center seam! Madison's Star is named after my daughter, Madison. My kids give me free labor on Mother's Day each year, which usually falls right before Quilt Market. Being so grateful for the help, I named this pattern after Madison. With over 15,000 made, she feels it's the best pattern out there because it's named after her. If you want to try this in miniature, look for the Olivia's Star — you guessed it, named after Madison's little sister.

CUTTING

Divide (or cut if using yardage) 2½" Strips into the following Groups:

Group	for Small quilt	for Large quilt
Group A	14	24
Group B	12	19
Group C	9	14
Group D	7	11
Group E	5	8
Group F	5	5
Group G	3	5

Cut the following Strips out of the Background Fabric:

Strip size	for Small quilt	for Large quilt
2½" x WOF	2	4
5" x WOF	4	8
5½" x WOF	2	4
6" x WOF	2	4
7" x WOF	2	4
4½" x WOF	1	2

Designer's Note: Each diamond strip set mirrors itself in the center, both horizontally and vertically. Each strip set will have two of the same Groups sewn together at the center. This is correct! All strips are 40" or WOF long unless otherwise indicated.



STRIP SETS

Arrange the Groups and Background Fabrics into the following strip set piles. Cut Strips down to necessary width and sew together in order:

Tip: Use a smaller stitch on your machine and press seams open!

Strip Set 1

2½" Background Fabric

2½" Strip Group A

1" Group B (Cut $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Strip into (2) 1" Strips, discard remaining $\frac{1}{2}$ ")

1" Group B

2½" Group A

2½" Background


LARGE QUILT:

This strip set is made with half of a width of fabric at 20".






Designer's Note: This strip set is made smaller in length because it is only used once in each diamond.

Cutting segments

Cut the following segments from the Strip Sets.


First number in parentheses indicates small quilt, second number indicates large quilt.



- (16, 32) 2" Segments of Strip Set 1
- (16, 32) 2" Segments of Strip Set 2
- (16, 32) 13/4" Segments of Strip Set 3
- (16, 32) 13/4" Segments of Strip Set 4
- (16, 32) 134" Segments of Strip Set 5
- (16, 32) 13/4" Segments of Strip Set 6
- (8, 16) 13/4" Segments of Strip Set 7


DIAMONDS


Piece the Diamonds




Make a Diamond Template

Lay a tri-fold presentation board flat. Draw two horizontal parallel lines 15" apart. Line up the 45 degree line of the ruler with one of the lines, making sure the end of the ruler forms a point for the diamond on the presentation board (not on your table). Draw a 45 degree line between the two parallel lines, following the ruler. Measure 15" from that drawn diagonal line, draw a second line.






With Large rotary cutter (and an old blade), cut out diamond template on all drawn lines.




Cut out the Diamonds

Lay template on top of pieced diamond and Line up side diamond points with center seam. Using a ruler lined up with the edge of the template, and a large rotary cutter, trim off excess from each diamond



CENTER STAR

On the reverse side of the diamonds, mark an "X" to indicate the ¼" seam allowances crossovers on each corner of the diamond. This will help with accuracy when piecing in the corner squares.




Cutting the Setting Fabric

FOR THE SMALL QUILT:

Out of Setting Fabric cut:

- (1) 31" Square, cut in half diagonally twice to make (4) setting triangles
- (4) 21½" squares



FOR LARGE QUILT:

Out of Setting Fabric Cut:

- (8) 21½" Squares
- (2) 37½" squares, cut in half diagonally once to make (4) setting triangles








Piecing the star

Assemble the star into (4) units made up of (2) diamonds and (1) Setting Square using these steps:


- 1. Sew the diamonds together first, pinning to match up ¼" Xs. Sew from point 1 to the point 2 (as shown), backstitching at the Xs. Press seam open.
- 2. Sew one side of the square to the diamond, starting with point 2 and sewing to point 3.
- 3. Sew the other side of the square to the diamond, starting with point 2 and sewing to point 4.



FOR THE SMALL QUILT:

Assemble the 4 units into the star, sewing in the triangles the same way. Mark the corner Xs first.

- Starting at point 1, sew to point 2. Press seam open. 1.
- 2. Starting at point 2, sew to point 3. Press seam open.
- 3. Starting at point 2, sew to point 4.





FOR LARGE QUILT:

Repeat previous step to join center star but use all setting squares. Do not cut into triangles.

Sew in remaining diamonds, start at point 1 and sew to point 2. Then start again with point 1 and sew to point 3. Press seams open.

Add large setting triangles as shown to square up quilt.






BORDERS

Simple border

Out of Setting fabric, cut:

(8) 4½" x WOF strips

Measure across length of quilt. Sew together strips to form 2 borders of that length. Find center of each side of quilt by folding in half, marking with pin. Do the same with each border. Pin borders in place, starting by matching pins,



easing in any excess. Sew on side borders. Press towards border.

Measure quilt width through the center. Repeat the same process to add $2\frac{1}{2}$ " wide borders to the top and bottom of quilt. Press.

Piano Key Border

Out of Setting Fabric Cut:


- (8) 2½" x WOF strips
- (4) 51/2" x WOF strips

INNER BORDER

Measure across length of quilt. Sew together 2½" wide setting fabric strips to form two borders to that length. Find center of each side of quilt by folding in half, marking with pin. Do the same with each border. Pin borders in place, starting by matching pins, easing in any excess. Sew on top and bottom inner borders. Press towards border.

PIANO KEY BORDER

Gather leftover strip sets. Remove background pieces, or trim down to 2½". Separate strip sets at center seams.




Sew strip sets together, forming one large strip set.

Measure across width of quilt. Cut 2½" lengths of strip set and sew together to make 2 borders for top and bottom of quilt.

Sew to top and bottom of quilt. Press.

Measure across length of quilt. Cut 2½" lengths of strip set and sew together to make 2 side borders.




Sew to both sides of quilt. Press.

OUTER BORDER


Measure quilt length through the center. Repeat the same process as above to add a $2\frac{1}{2}$ " wide border to the sides of quilt. Press.


Measure quilt width through the center. Repeat the same process as above to add a $5\frac{1}{2}$ " wide border to the top and bottom of quilt. Press seams towards borders.

- Go ahead and use those favorite strip sets you've collected and want to showcase!
- Shhhhh! This is a bargello technique! But only one seam needs to be matched up and no seam rippers or looping!

FABRIC REQUIREMENTS

	Small 80" x 80"	Large 100" x 100"
Diamond blocks to make	8	16
Bargello Fabrics: Use 2½" strip packages divided as follows:	2 pkgs	4 pkgs
Group A	(14) 2½" strips OR 1 yd	(24) 2½" strips OR 1¾ yds
Group B	(12) 2½" strips OR 1 yd	(19) 2½" strips OR 1½ yds
Group C	(9) 2½" strips OR 5/8 yd	(14) 2½" strips OR 1 yd
Group D	(7) 2½" strips OR ½ yd	(11) 2½" strips OR ¾ yd
Group E	(5) 2½" strips OR ¾ yd	(8) 2½" strips OR ⅓ yd
Group F	(5) 2½" strips OR 3/8 yd	(5) 2½" strips OR ¾ yd
Group G	(3) 2½" strips OR ¼ yd	(5) 2½" strips OR ¼ yd
Background fabric	2 yds	4 yds
Setting fabric*	4 yds	2½ yds

^{*}This includes enough for border depending on your choice of border. Cover quilt uses the same fabric for both the setting and background.
