


Quilt finishes 68" x 92" 45 Big Blocks: 8" x 8" 38 Small Blocks: 4" x 8"

Looking for a quilt that appeals to the men in your life? Look no further than this graphic design with prints that are sure to please. The dark background adds to the drama. Quick stitch-and-flip methods make a quick and easy construction.

Cutting Directions

Note: Read assembly directions before cutting patches. All measurements are cut sizes and include $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowances. A fat $\frac{1}{8}$ is a 9" x 20"-22" cut of fabric. A fat $\frac{1}{4}$ is an 18" x 20"-22" cut. Borders are cut the exact lengths required plus $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowances. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately $\frac{4}{2}$ " wide).

Fabric D Cut (7) strips $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF for binding

Cut (7) squares 4½"

Fabric E Cut (2) borders $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $80\frac{1}{2}$ ", cut lengthwise

Cut (2) borders 41/2" x 641/2", cut lengthwise

Cut (8) rectangles 6½" x 8½" Cut (180) squares 4½"

Cut (76) rectangles 2½" x 4½"

Cut (152) squares 21/2"

5 Prints From each:

Cut (7) squares $8\frac{1}{2}$ "

2 Prints From each:

Cut (3) squares 8½"

4 Fat $\frac{1}{4}$ **s** From each:

Cut (7) squares 4½"



Making the Quilt

1. The big blocks are made with quick stitch-and-flip piecing methods. With a white pencil or quilter's chalk, draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of each Fabric E (black) 4½" square. Referring to Diagram 1, place a marked square on a colored 8½" square, right sides together, aligning raw edges at the corner. Stitch on the drawn line; trim away and discard excess fabric. Press open. Repeat on the opposite corner, watching orientation of the sewing. Repeat on the remaining corners (Diagram 2). Make a total of 45 Big Blocks.





2. Referring to Diagram 3, use the method in Step 1 to sew Fabric E 2½" squares to the corners of the colored 4½" squares. Make 38 pieced squares. Sew Fabric E 2½" x 4½" rectangles to opposite sides of the square to make a small block. Make 38 total.





- **3.** Referring to the Quilt Diagram, arrange the Big Blocks, Small Blocks, and Fabric E 6½" x 8½" rectangles in 7 vertical columns as shown. Note the placement of the various prints. Once you are satisfied with the arrangement, join the blocks to make 7 columns. Join the columns.
- **4.** Sew long Fabric E borders to the sides and shorter borders to the top and bottom. Repeat to add Fabric C borders.

Finishing the Quilt

5. Layer the quilt with batting and backing and baste. Quilt in the ditch around borders and block patches. Bind to finish the quilt.



Quilt Diagram


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*Indicates fabrics used in quilt pattern. Fabrics shown are 25% of actual size.



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
