# Metalogic Quilt 

Introducing Andover Fabrics new collection: Rough Hewn by Andover Fabrics Quilt designed by Janet Houts

Quilt finishes 68' $x$ 92"
45 Big Blocks: 8' x 8'
38 Small Blocks: 4" x 8''
Looking for a quilt that appeals to the men in your life? Look no further than this graphic design with prints that are sure to please. The dark background adds to the drama. Quick stitch-and-flip methods make a quick and easy construction.

## Cutting Directions

Note: Read assembly directions before cutting patches. All measurements are cut sizes and include $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowances. A fat $1 / 8$ is a $9^{\prime \prime} \times 20^{\prime \prime}-22^{\prime \prime}$ cut of fabric. A fat $1 / 4$ is an $18^{\prime \prime} \times 20^{\prime \prime}-22^{\prime \prime}$ cut. Borders are cut the exact lengths required plus $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowances. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately 42 " wide).
Fabric A Cut (3) squares $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
Fabric B Cut (4) squares $81 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
Fabric C Cut (8) strips $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF, pieced to make the following:
(2) borders $2^{1} 12^{\prime \prime} \times 881 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
(2) borders $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 681 / 2^{\prime \prime}$

Fabric D Cut (7) strips 21/2" x WOF for binding Cut (7) squares $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$

Fabric E Cut (2) borders $41^{1 / 2^{\prime \prime}} \times 801^{\prime} / 2^{\prime \prime}$, cut lengthwise Cut (2) borders $41 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 641 / 2^{\prime \prime}$, cut lengthwise
Cut (8) rectangles $61 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 81 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
Cut (180) squares $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
Cut (76) rectangles $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
Cut (152) squares $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
5 Prints From each:
Cut (7) squares $81 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
2 Prints From each:
Cut (3) squares $81 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
4 Fat $1 / 4 \mathbf{S}$ From each:
Cut (7) squares $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
Backing Cut (2) panels $38^{\prime \prime} \times 100^{\prime \prime}$, pieced to fit quilt top with overlap on all sides

## Making the Quilt

1. The big blocks are made with quick stitch-andflip piecing methods. With a white pencil or quilter's chalk, draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of each Fabric E (black) $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square. Referring to Diagram 1, place a marked square on a colored $81 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square, right sides together, aligning raw edges at the corner. Stitch on the drawn line; trim away and discard excess fabric. Press open. Repeat on the opposite corner, watching orientation of the sewing. Repeat on the remaining corners (Diagram 2). Make a total of 45 Big Blocks.

2. Referring to Diagram 3, use the method in Step 1 to sew Fabric E $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares to the corners of the colored $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares. Make 38 pieced squares. Sew Fabric E $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles to opposite sides of the square to make a small block. Make 38 total.

3. Referring to the Quilt Diagram, arrange the Big Blocks, Small Blocks, and Fabric E $61 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 81 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles in $7 /$ vertical columns as shown. Note the placement of the various prints. Once you are satisfied with the arrangement, join the blocks to make 7 columns. Join the columns.
4. Sew long Fabric E borders to the sides and shorter borders to the top and bottom. Repeat to add Fabric C borders.

Finishing the Quilt
5. Layer the quilt with batting and backing and baste. Quilt in the ditch around borders and block patches. Bind to finish the quilt.
