



Cutting Directions

Note: Read assembly directions before cutting patches. Borders are cut to exact length required plus 1/4" seam allowance. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately 42" wide).

	Cut (1) $10\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip.
	Cut (1) 7" x WOF strip.

Fabric B	Cut (1) $10 \frac{1}{2}$ x WOF strip.
	Cut (2) 10" x WOF strips.

Fabric C	Cut (1) 10 ½" x WOF strip.
	Cut (1) 10" x WOF strip.
	Cut (1) 8 ½" x WOF strip.

Fabric D	Cut (1) 11" x WOF strip.
	Cut (1) $10 \frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip.
	Cut (1) 10" x WOF strip.

Fabric E	Cut (1) 12" x WOF strip.
	Cut (1) 10 ½" x WOF strip.

Making the Quilt

Fabric Requirements

1. Place the 7" x WOF Fabric A on a table, right side up. Place the 10" x WOF Fabric B on top of the Fabric A strip, right side up, overlapping the bottom of the Fabric A strip by about 6" (Diagram 1).

- **2.** Place pins through both layers of fabric to mark the edge of the bottom fabric and the top fabric.
- **3.** Take a fabric pencil and draw a gentle curved line on the top fabric, staying between the pins. NOTE: The curve doesn't have to be deep. The deeper the curve the harder it is to sew.
- **4.** Cut on the drawn line through both fabrics (Diagram 2). Unpin the scraps from the fabric. Pick up both pieces of fabric and place them right sides together. Slowly sew them together, easing the curves together as you go. Press open.



5. Repeat Steps 1-4 and refer to Diagrams 3-4 while using the Unit 1 strip and (1) 10 ½" x WOF Fabric C strip to make (1) Unit 2 strip.





- **6.** Repeat Steps 1-4 and refer to Diagram 5 on Page 4 for fabric identification, location and seam overlap measurement. Trim the block to measure $40 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $54 \frac{1}{2}$ " to make the Background strip.
- 7. Following the manufacturer's instructions, trace the listed number of each template onto the paper side of the fusible web. Roughly cut out each template about 1/8" outside the drawn lines.
- **8.** Press each template onto the wrong side of the fabrics as listed on the templates. Cut out each template on the drawn lines.


Quilt Top Assembly

(Refer to the Quilt Layout when assembling the quilt top.)

- **9.** Refer to the quilt layout to arrange and press the Fabric G birds and Fabric H branches onto the Background strip.
- **10.** Finish the raw edges of each shape with a decorative stitch such as a buttonhole or satin stitch to make the quilt top

Finishing the Quilt


- 11. Layer and quilt as desired.
- **12.** Sew the (5) Fabric G binding strips together, end to end with a 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
- 13. Bind as desired.
