

Quick Binding


with contrast flange. machine sewn. no pinning necessary fusible thread needed

Cut a contrast flange $1-\frac{1}{2}$ " by the necessary length (piece together as needed). Cut binding $1-\frac{1}{4}$ " by the necessary length (piece together as needed).





Fold pieced binding in half lengthwise; wrong sides together and press well. This creates the small flange you will be sewing on later.



Lay folded binding on the back of the quilt, flange side up. Sew to quilt using 1/4" seam allowance. Follow your favorite continuous binding method for corners and closure.

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
