Sewing Presser Feet

WHAT YOU WILL LEARN:

Using the correct presser foot can make your sewing easier and more accurate, but which one? There are so many to choose from, and they can be used as intended, or maybe not as intended, to get the look you want. This class is designed to help you learn how to use the basic feet included with your machine, as well as a few of my most frequently used and loved presser feet.

You <u>must</u> know how to use your machine; this is not a machine usage class. This class is designed to help you learn how to use the basic feet that were probably included with your machine, as well as a few of my most frequently used and loved presser feet. In the supply list will be the feet we will be using, and if there is time, we will go over even more, so bring all that you own! If you do not have all the feet, this class will help you determine if they are a tool you should own.

YOUR SUPPLY LIST (WHAT YOU NEED TO BRING):

- Machine in good working order
- ALL tools that came with your machine, especially the <u>Screwdriver</u> to change your needles
- Power cord and foot control
- Tool to change your ankle if your machine does not use snap on feet
- Extra universal needles, just in case
- Sewing Thread and full bobbin
- ALL the feet that came with your machine
- Blind hem foot, BL foot R
- Overcasting foot, BL foot G
- Rolled hem foot
- Edge Joining foot
- 1/4 inch foot
- Piping foot
- Open toe foot (Applique foot if you have one)
- Any other foot you have that you would like me to talk about
- Scrap fabric (woven, quilting cotton weight), pressed and cut into 4 inch strips
- Scrap 2mm Cording to use with your piping foot

Extra feet in case we have time:

- Gathering foot
- Ruffling foot
- Roller foot
- Cording feet
- Walking feet
- Invisible zipper foot
