## Starburst Quilt using Half Square Triangle Techniques

## WHAT YOU WILL LEARN:

Half-square triangles (HSTs) are a very fun and versatile quilting block that can be used to make a HUGE variety of quilt designs and patterns. This class will show you some easy techniques for making half-square triangles and give you an opportunity to learn to use a quilting tool to make perfect half-square triangles, which means crisp points on your quilting projects. This technique will then be used to create a "Starburst" quilt (finished size 58" x 58").

## YOUR SUPPLY LIST (WHAT YOU NEED TO BRING):

- PRECUT FABRIC FOR THE CLASS\* You are encouraged to purchase fabrics from Berger's, as this supports the shop. (Note: PLEASE COME WITH THE 10" SQUARES PRECUT. We will not wait while folks cut the squares during class).
  - 16-10" print or color squares (1-1/2 yards of fabric or 16 squares from a Layer Cake). These can be all the same fabric if you use yardage, or if from a layer cake, can be multiple colors.
  - 16-10" solid squares (1-1/2 yards of fabric or 16 squares from a solid Layer Cake). These can be solid fabric, a tone on tone fabric, or a fabric with no pattern but texture (like a subtle batik, grunge fabric or something similar). See the pictures for ideas. You are looking for contrast to the print/color.
  - $\frac{1}{2}$  yard for inner border (does not have to be precut & may be the same as the solid color)
  - <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> 1 yard for outer border (does not have to be precut & may be the same as the print color. Amount of yardage depends on how wide you want this outer border)
  - 3-1/4 yard for backing (does not have to be precut) OR 1-3/4 yards anti-pill fleece
- Triangular Square Up Ruler 9 1/2in from Quilt in a day Slotted Quilting Ruler (available at Berger's) \* OR the "Clearly Perfect Slotted Trimmer" (purchased elsewhere). YOU WILL NEED ONE OF THESE TOOLS FOR THE CLASS!!! Without this tool, the class will not be successful for you.
- Sewing machine which you know how to use well, and that is in good working order \*
- Sewing machine needles \*
- 1/4" foot for your machine \*
- Cotton thread and at least 2-3 pre-wound bobbins (suggest either white or off-white or whatever matches the fabrics you will be using) \*
- Rotary cutter (with a SHARP, preferably NEW blade) \*
- Long quilting ruler (preferably 5-6" wide and at least 18" long) \*
- Pins preferably long with glass heads \*
- Scissors to include regular shears and thread-snipper scissors \*

- Marking pens (recommend the Frixion Erasable Pens) \*
- Seam ripper\*
- Your lunch or a snack & something to drink (preferably water in case of spills)
- Paper and pen to take notes
- Optional Cutting mat. There are mats in the classroom, but if you have a portable cutting mat things will go more quickly. One I use and love is the Omnigrid Fold-away Portable Cutting & Pressing Station.
- Optional Portable iron or seam pressing tool. There are irons in the classroom, but if you have this and a pressing mat, things will go more quickly.

ROTARY CUTTERS AND RULERS WILL BE AVAILABLE AT THE STORE FOR YOUR USE.
