



# QUILT ON A CHAIR

with Debbie Spoelker

Two - 3 hour classes

You'll need a pattern from the shop if you don't have the book – **Scrap-o-lator** by Dianne Springer [which is out of print].

## **MATERIALS:**

**Chair** – Get a folding chair, but make sure the seat and are attached to the frame with screws; NOT RIVETS. Check both back and seat, as some chair have screws on the backs but use rivets for the seat. [Target has them in black for \$ 19.99 each. Feel free to paint them with a bright / wild color(s) if desired.]

**Foundation Fabric** – 1 yard ( $\frac{1}{3}$  pound) of an inexpensive sheet or any other medium weight white fabric [I use muslin or Kona Cotton]

**FUN Fabric** – Approximately 1 yard of scraps ( $\frac{1}{3}$  pound) for both the seat and back of the chair. It is a good idea for these to be trimmed so they have straight edges. You can trim your scraps stacked several at a time, varying the length and width for each batch.

**Cording** – you'll need  $\frac{1}{4}$  yard of fabric (2 ounces) [A fat quarter will work – striped materials are best. We'll be cutting this on the bias.] And, you'll need 3 yards of  $\frac{1}{2}$ " cording.

**Traditional Sewing Supplies** – Machine thread, a zipper foot to make the cording, etc.

**Fast-drying Glue** – Either Fabri-Tac or a hot glue gun (and glue sticks) will work

**Staple Gun and Staples** – I have a staple gun; get staples [Bostitch  $\frac{1}{4}$ " staples work the best]
