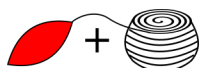


Blanket-A-Long Patterns

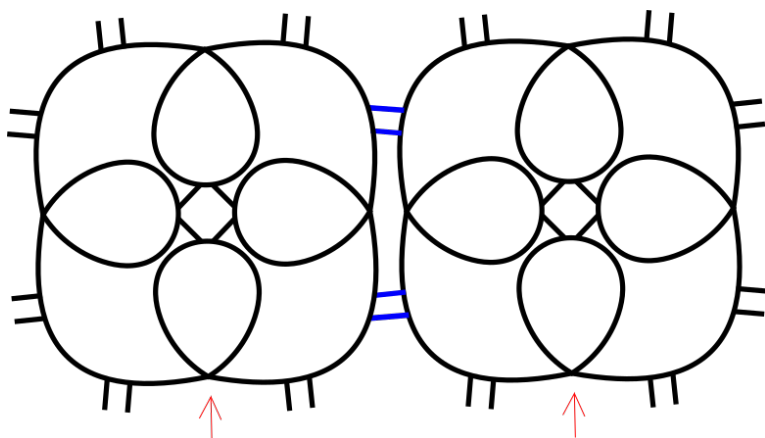
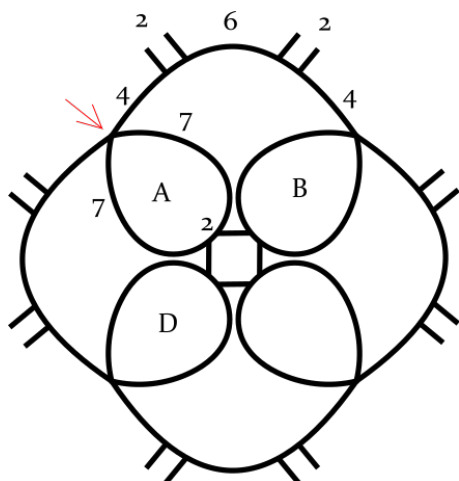

~ These 2 pattern options can be used to make various sizes of projects.



These 2 motifs were developed as part of a blanket-a-long and can be used to make enough motifs for smaller or larger projects, rectangles, diamonds, or squares. I used Olympus Large Tatting Thread (approximately size 8) to create the original motifs. You can use size 10, 20, etc. but you may need to adjust your stitch count. The red arrow indicates where to start. I wound about 1 yard on my shuttle per motif.



Abbreviations:

- C = chain
 - CR= close ring
 - RA, RB, RD = ring A, ring B, ring D
 - RW = reverse work
 - = picot
 - + = join
- The numbers are the number of stitches to make.

Written Pattern Version One:

RA: 7-2-7. CR. RW.

CH: 4-2-6-2-4. RW

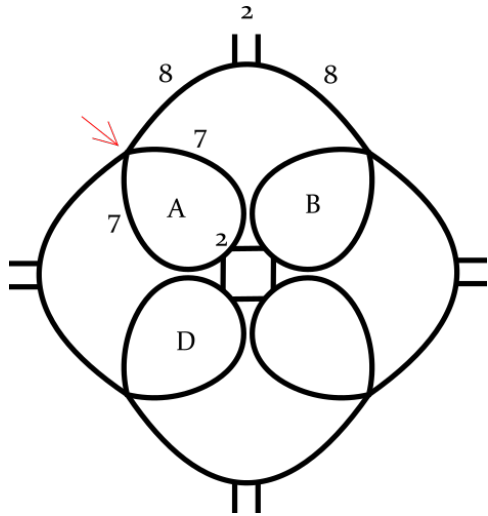
RB: 7+2-7. CR. RW

Repeat CH and RB, 1 times. Then repeat C1 again.

RD: 7+2+7

CH: 4-2-6-2-4. RW

Cut and tie ends together or cut and hide ends. As you add more motifs, join the picots on the chains to create a mat. The blue lines represent joins in the diagram.



Written Pattern Version Two:

RA: 7-2-7. CR. RW.

CH: 8-2-8. RW

RB: 7+2-7. CR. RW

Repeat CH and RB, 1 times. Then repeat C1 again.

RD: 7+2+7

CH: 8-2-8. RW

Cut and tie ends together or cut and hide ends. As you add more motifs, join the picots on the chains to create a mat. The blue lines represent joins in the diagram.
