

You Can Quilt! Building Skills for Beginners

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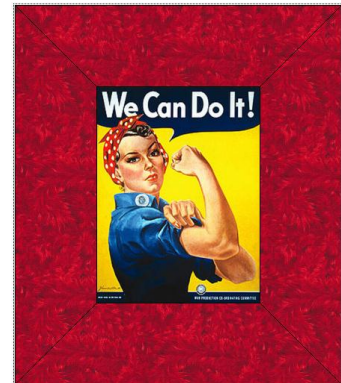
Mitered Rosie Pillow, approx. 18" x 21"

Materials Required:

(1) 12" tall Rosie the Riveter poster

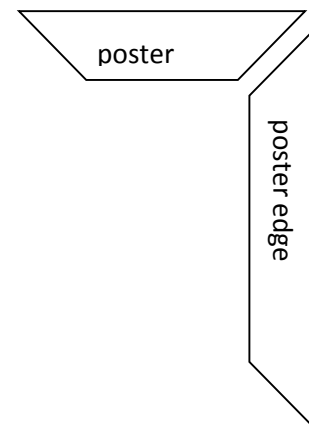
Border and backing: 5/8 yard

Stuffing: leftover batting, an old bed pillow or fiberfill



Cut:

Border strips are cut 5". Mark edge of border $\frac{1}{4}$ " less than the four edges of the poster ($\frac{1}{8}$ " on each end). Cut 2 short and 2 long border strips on a 45° angle from each mark so that the opposite side of the border is longer. Refer to block 11.2 for more details.



Assembly:

Mark the $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam intersection on the poster at each corner and on each border at each end of the narrow side. Align $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam intersections, right sides together and sew between each point. Press seam towards borders. Attach all four borders. Sew mitered seam at all four corners. Press.

Backing: Given the odd size of this pillow, a standard pillow form may not be easily available. These instructions assume you'll just want to stuff it and seal it.

Cut the back the same size as the front. Sew right sides together leaving an opening, trim corners, turn right side out, stuff and close.
