

Rapid Fire Lemoyne Star

Volcanos don't belong in the center of an eight-pointed star and they won't happen to you when you use the Rapid Fire Lemoyne Star tool. And, by the way, there will be no y-seams either! Be thoroughly stunned when you learn how to make a Lemoyne Star using a strip pieced method. You can make blocks as small as 3" all the way up to 12" with the same level of accuracy.

Deb Tucker has simplified the process of creating the traditional Lemoyne star by eliminating the need to use templates or to cut out special shapes. We'll use her method of slightly over sizing the components then trimming to size to create our units. Get ready to be amazed at what you can do with this tool!

Class Supplies

- Rapid Fire Lemoyne Star tool – available for purchase from the instructor the day of class

- Fabric for class – Please come to class with fabric cut into strips and squares per the table below.
- 6" x 24" Ruler, Cutting Mat & Rotary Cutter (with new blade)
- Sewing machine, Thread & bobbins, General sewing kit – scissors, pins, seam ripper, machine needles, etc.
- Units created in previous Tucker University classes

Pre-Class Cutting Instructions WOF = width of fabric, approx. 40" sq = square

Note: Cutting instructions are for a limited number of class samples.

I suggest using 'I wonder' (I wonder why I bought it) fabric to learn the techniques.

Fabric	Unit	Size	Quantity
Dark	For star points	2 1/2" x WOF	1 - 40" strip
Medium	For star points	2 1/2" x WOF	1 - 40" strip
Background	Contrasting to star points	3 3/4" x WOF	2 - 40" strips
