Christmas Wonders Calendar

28 X 28" (71 x 71 cm)

FABRIC REQUIREMENT:

Fabrics from series "Christmas Wonders", 44" (112 cm) wide.





OTHER SUPPLIES:

Batting: Matilda's Own 99M400, 94" (240 cm) wide 32" (80 cm)

In addition: Matching sewing and quilting thread.

The Basics: Whenever this symbol \circ appears in the directions, you will find a detailed explanation for "Basic Sewing" in the website www.stoffabrics.com under Inspiration.

CUTTING **□**:

1/4" (0,75 cm) seam allowance is included.

Fabric B: 2 Strips $2\frac{1}{2} \times 23\frac{7}{8}$ " (6,5 x 60,5 cm) Fabric B: 2 Strips $2\frac{1}{2} \times 28$ " (6,5 x 71 cm)

Fabric D. 1 Rectangle 32 x 32" (80 x 80 cm) Backing

Fabric C: 3 Strips 2³/₄ x 44" (7 x 112 cm) Binding


C: 4596-414 10" (25 cm)

D: 4596-413 32" (80 cm)

SEWING OF CALENDAR: Seam allowance is 1/4" (0,75 cm).

This calendar is in one piece, see image. If you want it to have 24 small pockets, the panel must be folded and sewn four times. So nothing must be cut.

At the left and right edges for each grid square you'll find two small metallic lines and text telling you to fold here, see image.






Start with the bottom row of pockets: Fold at the bottom lines across the width of the panel.

Sew a stitching above the grid line, see image.







NOTE: This seam will be placed at the top lines for folding.

After sewing fold back the seam and the first row of pockets come forward, see image.



Next fold the second row of pockets and do the same, see images.

Backside of panel

Sew the rest of the pocket rows like above and fold back the pockets. See images.



Now pin the pockets at each side and sew a stitching from under the big gnome motif to the bottom between all rows, see image.

After sewing of these stitchings the 24 pockets come forward.


Now join the strips in fabric B on each side of the calendar (B1) and next join the strips at the top and the bottom (B2).

QUILTING AND BINDING:

Layer top, batting and backing in fabric D and baste the pieces.

Quilt as you prefer by hand or by machine **3**.

Sew top binding in fabric C **□**.
