

Block HEADS



Block 11: Lisa's Star - Lisa Bongean
Use (1) light and (1) dark fabric. Fabrics are listed in order of use.

A - (6) squares, 1 5/8" $\times 1$ 5/8" (LIGHT)
B - (18) squares, $15 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times 15 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ (DARK) - cut (12) squares $\square$

C - (2) squares, $23 / 88^{\prime \prime} \times 23 / 8^{\prime \prime} \boxtimes$ (LIGHT)

E - (4) squares, 2" x 2" (LIGHT)
$\Delta=$ cut once diagonally from corner to corner
$\boxtimes=$ cut twice diagonally from corner to corner

- Assembly

1. Draw a diagonal line, corner to corner, on the wrong side of (1) A square and place on (1) B square, right sides together; pin in place. Stitch a $1 / 4$ " seam allowance on each side of drawn line. Cut in half and press pieced squares toward $B$. Make (12).

2. Sew (2) B triangles to (1) pieced square from Step 1, as shown. Make (12) pieced triangles.

3. Sew (1) pieced triangle from Step 2 to (1) C triangle; press toward pieced triangle. Make (4) pieced units.

4. Sew (4) pieced units together from Step 3; sew into rows, pressing rows in opposite directions. Sew rows together and press center seam open for Unit \#1.


Unit \#1
5. Sew (2) pieced triangles from Step 2 to short sides of (1) C triangle; press toward pieced triangles. Make (4) Unit \#2 Flying Geese.

6. Lay out Unit \#1, Unit \#2's, and E squares, as shown. Sew into rows; press each row in opposite direction. Sew rows together (press seams open) to create the Lisa's Star block measuring $6 ½$ " square.
