



Block 37: Double Delight Star - Kansas Trouble Quilters, Lynne Hagmeier, Designer Use (1) light and (2) dark fabrics. Fabrics are listed in order of use.

KT Layered Patchwork

A - (4) squares cut on bias 1 1/4" x 1 1/4" (LIGHT)

B - (5) squares, $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " (DARK#1)

• cut (1) B square

✓

C - (4) squares, 2 ½" x 2 ½" (LIGHT)

D - (4) squares, 1 ½" x 1 ½" \(\square \) (DARK #2)

E - (1) square, 2 ½" x 2 ½" (DARK #2)

 \square = cut once diagonally, corner to corner

□ = cut twice diagonally, corner to corner

Assembly

1. Layer (1) A square on (1) B square, right sides up and aligning lower right corners; glue in place. Topstitch 1/8" from bias edge of A square with coordinating cotton thread. Make (4) Unit #1.





Unit #1

2. Layer (1) B triangle on (1) C square, right sides up and aligning top edges; glue in place. Topstitch 1/8" from bias edge of B triangle with coordinating thread. Add (2) D triangles to the bottom left and bottom right of the C square, aligning edges, gluing in place, and topstitching. Make (4) Unit #2.







Unit #2

3. Lay out Unit #1's, Unit #2's, and E square, as shown. Sew into rows; press each row toward Unit #1's. Sew rows together (press seam open) to create the Dot Dash block measuring 6 ½" square.






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Use (1) light and (2) dark fabrics. Fabrics are listed in order of use.

KT Traditional Patchwork

- A (12) squares, 1½" x 1½" (LIGHT)
- B (8) rectangles, $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " (DARK#1)
- C (8) squares, 1½" x 1½" (DARK #2)
 - D (4) rectangles, 1½ " x 2½" (LIGHT)
 - E (4) squares, 1½" x 1½"(DARK #1)
 - F (1) square, $2 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $2 \frac{1}{2}$ " (DARK #2)

Assembly

- 1. Layer (1) A square on one end of (1) B rectangle; pin in place. Stitch diagonally across A
- square. Trim to a ¼" seam allowance and press toward B. Repeat for opposite end of B, as shown.
- Make (4) Flying Geese units.







2. Using C squares and D rectangles, repeat the process to make (4) C/D flying geese. Make (4) Flying Geese units.







3. Pin and join (2) Flying Geese as shown - 1 from Step 1 and 1 from Step 2. Press toward top unit. Make (4) units.





4. Join (1) A square and (1) E square as shown. Press toward the A square. Make (4) units.

5. Join (1) A/E square unit and (1) B rectangle as shown. Press toward the rectangle. Make (4) units.







6. Lay out Unit #1's, Unit #2's, and E square, as shown. Sew into rows; press each row toward Unit #1's. Sew rows together (press seam open) to create the Dot Dash block measuring $6\frac{1}{2}$ " square.











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
