## Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Pine Boughs - Light Blue (A), cut:
-(1) $15 \frac{11 / 2 "}{} \times$ WOF strip. Sub-cut (1) 15 " $\times 41 / 2 "$ strip, (1) 11 " $\times 41 / 2 "$ strip, (1) $61 / 2 " \times 41 / 2 "$ strip, (2) $61 / 2 " \times 21 / 2 "$ strips, and (1) $41 / 2 " \times 81 / 2 "$ strip.

- (1) $41 / 2 " x$ WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) $41 / 2 "$ squares and
(6) $27 / 8 "$ squares.

From the Pine Boughs - Cream (B), cut:

- (1) $21 / 2 " \times$ WOF strip. Sub-cut (3) $21 / 2 " \times 61 / 2 "$ strips.

From the Pine Boughs - Tan (C), cut:
-(1) $61 / 2 " \times$ WOF strip. Sub-cut (3) $61 / 2 " \times 21 / 2 "$ strips and (2) $47 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ squares.

From the Mixed Media Wander - Cream (D), cut:

- (1) $21 / 2 " \times$ WOF strip. Sub-cut (3) $21 / 2 " \times 61 / 2 "$ strips.

From the Mixed Media Wander - Green (E), cut:

- (1) 15 " x WOF strip. Sub-cut (1) $41 / 2 " \times 15 "$ strip,
(1) $6^{1 / 2 "} \times 4 \frac{1}{2 \prime}$ " strip, (2) $41 / 2 " \times 81 / 2 "$ strip, (3) $21 / 2 " \times 41 / 2 "$ strips and (2) $41 / 2 "$ squares.
-(1) $47 / 8$ x WOF strip. Sub-cut (3) $47 / 8 "$ squares and
(8) $27 / 8 "$ squares.

From the Mixed Media Wander - Navy (F), cut:

- (1) $81 / 2 " \times$ WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) $81 / 2 " \times 41 / 2 "$ strips,
(2) $81 / 2 " \times 21 / 2 "$ strips, and (2) $21 / 2 " \times 61 / 2 "$ strips.
- (1) $61 / 2 " \times$ WOF strip. Sub-cut (1) $61 / 2 " \times 41 / 2 "$ strip,
(1) $61 / 2 " \times 21 / 2 "$ strip, and (8) $27 / 8$ squares.
- (1) $41 / 2 " \times$ WOF strip. Sub-cut (3) $41 / 2 "$ squares, (1) $41 / 2 " \times 81 / 2 "$ strip, and (2) $21 / 2 "$ squares.

From the Half Square Triangle - Cream (G), cut:

- (1) $81 / 2 " \times$ WOF strip. Sub-cut (3) $81 / 2 " \times 21 / 2 "$ strips.

From the Half Square Triangle - Brown (H), cut:

- (1) $153 / 8$ " x WOF strip. Sub-cut (1) $153 / 8 "$ square, (1) 8 " square, and (3) $47 / 8$ " squares. Cut the $153 / 8 "$ square across both diagonals to make (4) $153 / 8$ " triangles. Note: You will only use (3) of the $153 / 8$ " triangles. Cut the 8 " square across (1) diagonal to make (2) 8 " triangles.

From the Half Square Triangles - Forest (I), cut:

- (1) $81 / 2 " \times$ WOF strip. Sub-cut (3) $81 / 2 " \times 21 / 2 "$ strips and
(3) $27 / 8$ squares.
-(1) $21 / 2 " x$ WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) $21 / 2 " \times 41 / 2 "$ strips and
(3) $21 / 2 "$ squares.

From the Dots and Dashes - Rust (J), cut:

- (1) $153 / 8$ " x WOF strip. Sub-cut (1) $153 / 8$ " square. Cut the square across both diagonals to make (4) $153 / 8$ " triangles. Note: You will only use (2) of the triangles.

From the Dots and Dashes - Forest (K), cut:

- (1) $47 / 8 " \times$ WOF strip. Sub-cut (3) $47 / 8 "$ squares,
(1) $41 / 2 " \times 15$ " strip and (1) $41 / 2 " \times 11$ " strip.
- (1) $41 / 2 " x$ WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) $41 / 2 " 81 / 2 "$ strips and
(2) $41 / 2 "$ squares.
- (1) $27 / 8 " x$ WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) $27 / 8 "$ squares and
(4) $21 / 2 "$ squares.
- (1) $21 / 2 " \times$ WOF strip. Sub-cut (3) $21 / 2 " \times 61 / 2 "$ strips and
(3) $21 / 2 " \times 41 / 2 "$ strips.

From the Dots and Dashes - Navy (L), cut:

- (1) $27 / 8 " x$ WOF strip. Sub-cut (12) $27 / 8 "$ squares.
- (1) $21 / 2 " \times$ WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) $21 / 2 " \times 1 / 2 "$ strips.
-(6) $21 / 2 " \times$ WOF strips for the binding.
From the Feathers - Light Blue (M), cut:
- (1) $41 / 2 " \times$ WOF strip. Sub-cut (1) $41 / 2 " \times 15 "$ strip,
(1) $41 / 2 / 2 \times 6 \frac{1 / 2 "}{}$ strip, and (1) $41 / 2 "$ square.
- (1) $27 / 8 " \times$ WOF strip. Sub-cut (3) $27 / 8 "$ squares and
(2) $21 / 2 " \times 81 / 2 "$ strips.

From the Feathers - Cream (N), cut:

- (4) $27 / 8 " x$ WOF strips. Sub-cut (53) $27 / 8 "$ squares.

From the Feathers - Rust (O), cut:

- (1) 8 " square. Cut the square across (1) diagonal to make
(2) 8 " triangles.


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## Cutting Instructions－Continued

Please note：All strips are cut across the width of fabric （WOF）from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted．

From the Argyle－Cream（P），cut：
－（1） $81 / 2 " \times 21 / 2 "$ WOF strip．
From the Argyle－Cocoa（Q），cut：
－（1） $47 / 8 " \times$ WOF strip．Sub－cut（5） $47 / 8 "$ squares．
From the Argyle－Rust（R），cut：
－（1） $153 / 8$＂x WOF strip．Sub－cut（1） $153 / 8$＂square and （5） $47 / 8$＂squares．Cut the $153 / 8$＂square across both diagonals to make（4） $153 / 8$＂triangles．Note：You will only use（3） $153 / 8$＂triangles．

From the Mini Trees－Blue（S），cut：
－（1） $27 / 8 " \times$ WOF strip．Sub－cut（8） $27 / 8 "$ squares．
－（1） $21 / 2 " \mathrm{x}$ WOF strip．Sub－cut（2） $21 / 2 " \times 41 / 2 "$ strips and
（2） $21 / 2 "$ squares．
From the Mini Trees－Cream（T），cut：
－（1） $8 \frac{1}{2 \prime} \times$ WOF strip．Sub－cut（2） $21 / 2 " \times 81 / 2 "$ strips and （3） $21 / 2 \times \times 41 / 2 "$ strips．

## From the Mini Trees－Green（U），cut：

－（1） 11 ＂x WOF strip．Sub－cut（1） 11 ＂x $41 / 2 "$ strip，
（2） $61 / 2 " \times 21 / 2 "$ strips，（3） $21 / 2 " \times 61 / 2 "$ strips，and（4） $41 / 2 "$ squares．
－（1） $47 / 8 " x$ WOF strip．Sub－cut（5） $47 / 8 "$ squares，（1） $27 / 8 "$ square，and（2） $21 / 2$＂squares．

## From the Feathers－Rust（Backing），cut：

－（2） 59 ＂x WOF strips for the backing．Sew the strips together and trim to make the 59 ＂x 59 ＂back．

## Block Assembly

## Note：The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction．Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components．

1．Place（1） $27 / 8 "$ Fabric S square on top of（1） $27 / 8$＂Fabric N square，right sides together．Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square（Fig．1）．Sew $1 / 4$＂away from each side of the drawn diagonal line（Fig．1）．Cut the（2）squares apart on the drawn diagonal line（Fig．2）to make（2）half－square triangles． Trim the half－square triangles to measure $21 / 2$＂square to make（2）Unit 1 squares（Fig．3）．Repeat to make（16）Unit 1 squares total．

2．Repeat Step 1 and refer to Figures 4－11 for fabric identification and placement to make（16）Unit 2 squares （Note：Only（15）Unit 2 squares will be used），（24）Unit 3 squares，（12）Unit 4 squares，（16）Unit 5 squares，（8） Unit 6 squares（Note：Only（7）Unit 6 squares will be used）， （6）Unit 7 squares，（6）Unit 8 squares and（2）Unit 9 squares．

4．Repeat Step 3 and refer to Figures 13－17 for fabric identification and placement to make（6）Unit 11 squares （Note：Only（3）Unit 11 squares will be used），（4）Unit 12 squares（Note：Only（2）Unit 12 squares will be used），（4） Unit 13 squares（Note：Only（2）Unit 13 will be used），（4） Unit 14 squares（Note：Only（2）Unit 14 squares will be used）and（2）Unit 15 squares（Note：Only（1）Unit 15 square will be used）．

5. Sew (1) $21 / 2 " \times 41 / 2 "$ Fabric K strip to the right side of (1) Unit 10 square, along the Fabric U side. Sew (1) $2^{1 / 2} \times 6^{1 / 2 "}$ Fabric A strip to the top of the newly sewn block to make (1) Unit 16 square (Fig. 18). Repeat to make a second Unit 16 square.
6. Sew (1) $21 / 2 " \times 61 / 2 "$ Fabric D strip to the right side of (1) Unit 16 square. Sew (1) $21 / 2 " \times 81 / 2 "$ Fabric T strip to the top of the newly sewn block to make (1) Unit 17 square (Fig. 19). Repeat to make a second Unit 17 square.

7. Sew together (1) Unit 1 square, (1) Unit 2 square, (1) Unit 3 square and (1) Unit 5 square, in that order from top to bottom. Sew the resulting strip to the right side of (1) Unit 17 square (Fig. 20).
8. Sew together (1) Unit 1 square, (1) Unit 2 square, (1) Unit 3 square, (1) Unit 4 square, and (1) $21 / 2$ " Fabric U square, in that order from left to right. Sew the resulting strip to the top of (1) Unit 17 square to make (1) $101 / 2$ " Block One square (Fig. 20). Repeat to make a second Block One square.

9. Repeat Steps 5-8 and refer to Figures 21-26 for component identification, placement and orientation to make (3) Block Two squares, (1) Block Three square, (2) Block Four squares, (2) Block Five squares, (2) Block Six squares and (1) Block Seven square.

10. Follow Figure 27 and sew together the assorted pieced blocks and assorted triangles to make the Center Block.

11. Place (1) $41 / 2 "$ Fabric A square on the left side of (1) $41 / 2 " \times 81 / 2 "$ Fabric F strip, right sides together (Fig. 28). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 28). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 29). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $1 / 4$ " seam allowance.

12. Place (1) $41 / 2 "$ Fabric M square on the right side of the $41 / 2 " \times 81 / 2 "$ Fabric F strip, right sides together (Fig. 30). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 30). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $1 / 4 "$ seam allowance to make (1) Unit 18 strip (Fig. 31).

## FOLK ART FLANNELS IV

Quilt Top Assembly (Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.) 13. Sew together (1) $41 / 2 " \times 11 "$ Fabric A strip, (1) Unit 20 strip, (1) $41 / 2 " \times 61 / 2 "$ Fabric F strip, (1) Unit 21 strip and (1) $41 / 2 " \times 11 "$ Fabric K, in that order from top to bottom, strip to make the Left Side Border.
14. Repeat Step 13 and refer to the Quilt Layout for component identification, placement and orientation to make the Right Side Border.
15. Sew together (1) $41 / 2 " \times 15 "$ Fabric K strip, (1) Unit 18 strip, (1) $41 / 2 " \times 61 / 2 "$ Fabric E strip, (1) Unit 19 strip and (1) $41 / 2 " \times 15 "$ Fabric M strip, in that order from left to right, to make the Top Border.
16. Repeat Step 15 and refer to the Quilt Layout for component identification, placement and orientation to make the Bottom Border.
17. Measure the sides of the Center Block and trim the Left and Right Side Borders to that length. Sew the Left Side Border and Right Side Border to the left and to the right of the Center Block.
18. Measure the top and bottom of the Center Block (after adding the Side Borders). Trim the Top Border and Bottom Border to that length and sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.
19. Layer and quilt as desired.
20. Sew the (6) $21 / 2 " \times$ WOF Fabric L strips together, end to end with 45 -degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
21. Bind as desired.
