Fabric Suggestions

I suggest using smaller prints for this quilt, though Color Three could be a slightly larger print. Most pieces are 2" or 4" when finished so keep this in mind as you select fabrics. There is no sashing used in the quilt assembly.

If you want to make a scrappy quilt, make sure you have at least the total yardage plus an extra $\frac{1}{4}$ yard for the quilt size you select. For example, six quarter yards cuts would work well if the total yardage from the pattern was 1 1/4 yard total.

There is very little "extra" fabric worked into the yardage totals.

Because of the way this quilt is assembled, precuts would not work well.

Prepare to travel September 7-14, 2025

SALL AWAY MYSTERY WOF = width of fabric. At least 40" wide.

We are off on a grand adventure and want to include you in a fun, unique way.

As we pack our bags to cruise the Caribbean celebrating Cindy's big birthday, we want you to start collecting your fabrics. There will be a sail away mystery sewalong taking place while we are gone and you won't want to miss it.

There are three excursions you can take – the first will cause your quilt to measure 48x48 and does not include borders, one will cause your quilt to finish at 60x60 (which just adds borders to the 48x48 option), and the last will finish at 60x72 which includes additional blocks and borders.

Prepare to travel through different ports of call September 7-14, sewing seams and sailing waters. Any experience level is welcome - there is no applique or curved seams.

The navigator (or pattern) will be posted on the Quilter's Hideaway Facebook page as well as emailed out and updated on the website daily. Grab your fabric, find a spot on the Veranda or behind your sewing machine, and let the adventures begin!

FLY IN DAY - PREP WORK

They say you must fly in or arrive the day before a cruise, so today is a travel day for several members in our party. That translates to Prep day for all of you preparing to "sail away" with us.

This is not a requirement, but sub-cutting strips of your fabric will take away the bulk of cutting out of future sew days and help you move along each day.

Also become familiar with the three sizing options. Excursion 48 and 60 are identical until borders, Excursion 72 will have small adjustments on specific days.

Clean your machine, replace the needle and wind a couple bobbins. The adventure is about to begin.

DAY ONE – Lets Begin.

Today is the day! There is a sail away party at 4pm. We will have ice cream in hand, waving at the shoreline with Mickey and friends, while you are rocking and rolling behind your machine.

Today we will begin sewing and sub-cutting strip sets. I love coming up with creative ways to make quilts and my goal in a mystery quilt is to always keep you guessing on what the finished quilt will actually look like. Strip sets are one of my favorite ways to accomplish this. They are also super handy to keep you from having to cut 200 small squares only to sew everything back together again. Let's be honest, if a pattern has you cut 200 of anything as the first step, most of us will tuck that sweet quilt back in the box and move along. No worries, we will not be doing any of that here!

You will also notice a teal background on some of the steps. This is only for Excursion 72 (the largest option). Everyone will complete all the steps, and Excursion 72 will have a few extra steps some days. If you're doing Excursion 48 or Excursion 60, IGNORE the teal boxes.

Another thing, I tried to write the pattern so any skill level is easily able to accomplish the quilt. However, if you get stumped on a block or have any questions, head to the Facebook page or send an email to qiultershideaway@gmail.com and I have help lined up ready to get you going.

I also have planned posts every afternoon on the Quilter's Hideaway Facebook page where you can see what my blocks looked like for Excursion 48/60. Again, if you have questions we are happy to help.

My last note, I mentioned to several of you that you needed three fabrics that contrasted to your background. You'll notice in the photos on Facebook that my Color One was very similar to my Background color, and I think it would have had a much different outcome with more contrast. Every color combination will be great and we cannot wait to see your blocks!

WOF = width of fabric. At least 40" wide.

Fabric:

MATERIALS NEEDED:



2 2 1/2" X WOF CUT IN HALF COLOR TWO

- 1 2 1/2" X WOF CUT IN HALF COLOR THREE
 - 2 4 1/2" X WOF CUT IN HALF
- 1 2 1/2" X WOF CUT IN HALF BACKGROUND
 - 2 4 1/2" X WOF CUT IN HALF
 - 3 2 1/2" X WOF CUT IN HALF

If making Excursion 72 - You need one additional Color Three 2 1/2" strip cut into 8 2 1/2" squares.


Assembly:

Sew strip sets together as shown.

- Sew a strip set together using a background 4 1/2" half strip, a color one 2 1/2" half strip and a background 2 1/2" half strip.
- Press the seams towards the background fabric.
- Subcut this strip set every 2 1/2" to give 8 units.




• Repeat this process to make eight of the following strip sets.




Make 8 of each unit using half strips, sewing strip sets, then subcutting at 2 1/2"

Excursion 72 **ONLY** - Draw a diagonal line on the back side of the 8 extra 2 1/2" Color Three squares. Line them up on the first two units (with background and color one only) and sew on the line. Repeat this so four of each have the additional blue triangle. Pay attention to the image below to know what angle each needs to be sewn at.



Now cut the remaining half strips into 10" long pieces. Using those 10" long pieces sew two additional strip sets as shown.



You should have cut one 2 1/2" Color Three down to 10", one Color Two 2 1/2", One background 4 1/2" and one Color Three 4 1/2".


 Subcut these every 2 1/2" to make four of each unit.





DAY TWO -

Today we are waking up floating along the ocean somewhere. It's an "At Sea" day, so it's a perfect day to sew a little.

My favorite part of sea days are watching the sun rise and set. It is absolutely spectacular!

Anyways, enough about our Sea Day, you want to SEW!

Today you're working on blocks using a couple units from yesterday and some Half Square Triangle blocks.

Half Square Triangle blocks can be made a few different ways, but today I'll walk you through my favorite way - just remember to trim the blocks at the end. It really does make a difference.

Excursion 72 - You aren't special today. No extra steps or instructions for y'all.

The last note I have is if you feel like you're falling behind, take a deep breath. Some days will have more to do than others. I worked in a few "easy" days for you to use as catch up. And just remember, everyone sews at their own speed and it isn't a race!

WOF = width of fabric. At least 40" wide.

MATERIALS NEEDED:

COLOR TWO

- 1 3" x WOF
 - cut into eight 3" squares
- 1 2 1/2" x WOF
 - cut into sixteen 2 1/2" squares


- 1 3" x WOF
 - cut into eight 3" squares
- 1 $41/2" \times WOF$
 - cut into eight 4 1/2" squares


Make half-square triangle blocks

- Lay one Color Two 3" square and one Background 3" square right sides together.
- Draw a line corner to corner.
- Sew 1/4" on either side of the line.
- Cut along the line and press.
- Trim blocks to 2 1/2" each.
- Repeat to make sixteen half square triangle blocks total.



Sew a four patch unit


Using the half square triangle blocks and eight 21/2" background squares, make eight four patches.




• Repeat to make eight blocks.

Finish assembling the block

 Now use the eight half square triangle four-patches and eight background 4 1/2" squares to ássemble four blocks.



 Finally add the two strip sets that were remaining from day one.



DAY THREE -

Today we woke up in Cozumel, Mexico and the water is STUNNING here.

We are going to have a low-key day around the boat and might get off for just a bit to walk around.

You all also get a low-key "catch-up" day too.

All excursions are making the same blocks today and we introduce "Snowballing" to the instructions.

Again, if you have any questions we are more than happy to help. Otherwise, share your blocks so we can continuing partying with everyone and see how the blocks are taking shape!

Take a nap, read a book, enjoy the day and get ready for tomorow!

WOF = width of fabric. At least 40" wide.




Snowball Color One:

- Draw a line on the wrong sides of Color One 41/2" squares.
- Lay one Color One square right sides together in the corner of the background 8 1/2" square.
- Sew along drawn line, trim and press.
- Now lay a second Color One square right sides together onto the adjacent corner of the background 8 1/2" square.
- Sew along drawn line, trim and press.
- · Repeat to make four.




Snowball Color Two:

- · Draw a line on the wrong sides of Background 2 1/2" squares.
- Lay one Background square on one end of Color Two 2 1/2" x 8 1/2" piece right sides together.
- Sew along drawn line, trim and press.
- Now lay a second Background 2 1/2" square right sides together onto the other end of the Color Two unit.
- Sew along drawn line, trim and press.
- Repeat to make four.



Assemble the block:

- Now sew one Color One Snowballed unit onto one Color Two Snowballed unit.
- Repeat to make four identical units.

DAY FOUR -

Hello Grand Cayman!

How is your adventure going? Have you figured out what the quilt will look like yet?

This is a big day and then its downhill from here. We've reached the halfway point, so it's time to knock out a few things around the ship, get some blocks done, and see what this quilt is going to look like.

We are making Flying Geese blocks today, and if you've done any of my patterns before, you know I sneak these in almost every time. There are also two different methods of sewing them that we will use today.

Excursion 72 - look for your teal box again. You have a few additional steps to follow for today.

WOF = width of fabric. At least 40" wide.

MATERIALS NEEDED:



- $31/8" \times WOF$
 - Cut 12 3 1/8" squares
- 2 1/2" x WOF
 - Cut 16 2 1/2" squares

COLOR TWO

- 1 4 1/2" X WOF
 - Cut eight 4 1/2" squares
- 5 1/2" x WOF
 - Cut one 5 1/2" square
 - Cut four 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" pieces

COLOR THREE

- 3 1/8" X WOF
 - Cut 20 3 1/8" squares

BACKGROUND

- 5 1/2" X WOF
 - Cut eight 5 1/2" squares
 - Cut one 4 1/2" square
- 2 1/2" X WOF
 - Cut 20 2 1/2" squares

Additional Cutting for Excursion 72.

COLOR ONE

- 2 1/2" x WOF Cut four 2 1/2" squares **COLOR TWO**
 - 4 1/2" X WOF Cut four 4 1/2" squares.

COLOR THREE

1 3 1/8" x WOF - Cut 12 3 1/8" squares.


BACKGROUND

5 1/2" X WOF -Cut three 5 1/2" squares. Cut four 2 1/2" squares

Sňowball Accent Geese: (Color One/Color Two)


- Draw a line on the wrong sides of 16 Color One 2 1/2"
- Lay one Color One square right sides together one one side of Color Two $21/2" \times 41/2"$.
- Sew along drawn line, trim and press.
- Now lay a second Color One square right sides together onto the other corner of the Color Two 2 1/2" x 4 1/2"
- Sew along drawn line, trim and press.

Peneat to make four accent geese.



Fast Four Geese: (Color Three/Background)

- Draw a line corner to corner diagonally on each of the Color Three 3 1/8" squares.
- Lay two Color Three squares onto the Background 5 1/2" square as shown.
- Sew 1/4" seam on either side of the lines drawn.
- Cut along the line and press seams. This makes a heart shaped unit.
- Now add one 3 1/8" Color Three square on each heart unit as shown.
- Sew 1/4" seam on either side of the line and repeat with the other heart shaped unit.
- Cut along the line and press to make four flying geese units.
- Trim each to $21/2" \times 41/2"$. Repeat using all eight 51/2"background squares to make 20 Color Three/Background Geese Units.
- Also use 12 Color One 3 1/8" squares paired with Three Background 5 1/2" squares to make 12 Color One/Background Geese Units.



WOF = width of fabric. At least 40" wide.

Additional Piecing for Excursion 72.

- In addition to the flying geese made in prior steps, make 12 more Color Three and Background geese using three background 5 1/2" squares and 12 Color Three 3 1/8" squares.
- Trim the 12 flying geese blocks to $21/2" \times 41/2"$

Sew the star blocks together:

- Assemble the star blocks together as shown.

 Each block uses Two Color One 2 1/2" squares Two Background 2 1/2" squares Four Color Three/Background Geese One Color Two 4 1/2" square

DAY FIVE -

We are at Falmouth, Jamaica today and ready to explore.

Excursion 72, you knew it was coming... you will be busy today while the others only have to begin assembling the quilt.

All of the units for the quilt have been made at this point, so all that is left is putting everything together.

We will start that process today, finish it tomorrow, and add borders on Day Seven. The Finish Line is close!

WOF = width of fabric. At least 40" wide.

Additional Piecing for Excursion 72.

MATERIALS NEEDED:



- 2 1/2" X WOF
 - Cut two 2 1/2" x 20"

The remaining 21/2" strip from day 4

Cut three 2 1/2" x 10"

COLOR TWO

The remaining 41/2" strip from day 4

Cut two 4 1/2" squares

COLOR THREE

- 21/2" X WOF
 - Cut two 2 1/2" x 10"

BACKGROUND

- 4 1/2" X WOF CUT IN HALF
- 2 1/2" X WOF
 - Cut four 2 1/2" x 10"

The remaining 5 1/2" strip from day 4

- Cut two 2 1/2" x 4 1/2"
- Cut four 2 1/2" x 6 1/2"

Sew strip sets together as shown.

- · Sew a strip set together using a Background 4 1/2" half strip and a Color One 2 1/2" half strip.
- Press the seams towards the background
- Subcut this strip set every 2 1/2" to give 8 units.


• Repeat this process to make FOUR of the following strip sets.

- Repeat to make two.





Is anyone having withdrawls from the shop? I'm ready to be back!!



It's also your LAST day of instructions for our Sail Away Mystery Quilt.

Excursion 48 has one small border to finish it out, but Excursion 60 and 72 wrap up today with a couple more borders. Easy Peasy!

Pack it up, Finish those seams, Clean the room – It's time to head out and get back to reality!



Assembly:

Excursion 48 and Excursion 60:

- Now add the 2 1/2" Background border, the 2 1/2" Color Two Border then the 4 1/2" Color Three outer border.
- Éxcursion 48 only has a 2 1/2" Background border to finish it.



Excursion 72:

- Use the two units made at the on Day Five and add them onto the top and bottom of the Center piece finished on Day Six.
- Lastly, add the 2 1/2" Background border, the 2 1/2" Color Two border and the outer 4 1/2" Color Three border.
