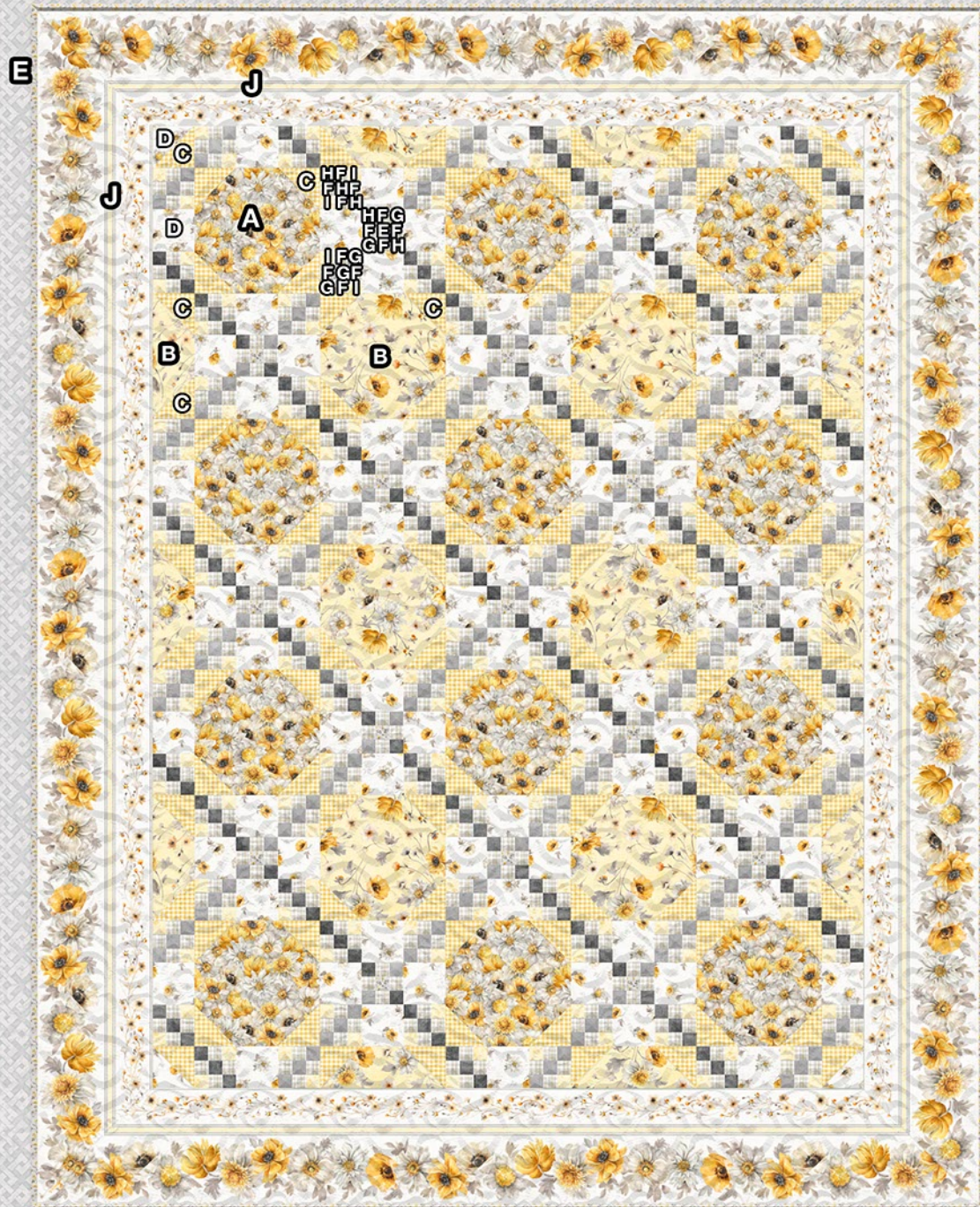

BASIC Twin Quilt #6 Versions 1 & 2

Please read all instructions carefully AND identify all fabrics before beginning.

All instructions include a 1/4" seam allowance and strips are cut selvege to selvege, unless stated otherwise.

1. Cut the following (Versions 1 & 2):

Fabric A - Cut (3) 9-1/2" strips, subcut (12) 9-1/2" squares

Fabric B - Cut (3) 9-1/2" strips, subcut (6) 9-1/2" squares and (10) 3-1/2" x 9-1/2" pieces

Fabric C - Cut (1) 3-7/8" strip, subcut (2) 3-7/8" squares [then cut in half diagonally  for 4 triangles] and (8) 3-1/2" squares
Cut (7) 3-1/2" strips, subcut (84) 3-1/2" squares

Fabric D - Cut (1) 3-7/8" strip, subcut (2) 3-7/8" squares then cut in half diagonally  for 4 triangles
Cut (7) 3-1/2" strips, subcut (82) 3-1/2" squares

Fabric E (Version 2 only) - Cut (9) 2-1/2" strips (binding)
Cut (1) 1-1/2" strip

Fabric E (Version 1 only) - Cut (7) 2-1/2" strips (binding)
Cut (1) 1-1/2" strip

Fabric F - Cut (20) 1-1/2" strips

Fabrics G, H, and I - From each fabric:
Cut (8) 1-1/2" strips

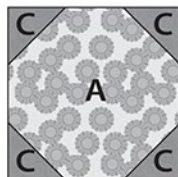
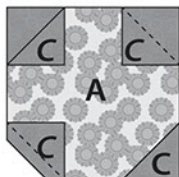
Fabric J (Version 2 only) - Referring to the quilt image, fussy cut strips, the length of fabric parallel to selvege: (2) 8-3/4" x 90" and (2) 8-3/4" x 72" multi-stripe borders

2. Piecing Order (Versions 1 & 2):

1. Draw a diagonal line across the wrong side of all the **Fabric C** 3-1/2" squares. 

Letters in italics indicate wrong side of fabric.

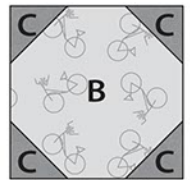
2. Arrange 4 marked **Fabric C** 3-1/2" squares wrong sides together on corners of a **Fabric A** 9-1/2" square as shown. Stitch along the marked lines. Trim seam allowances to 1/4". Press corners out. Make a total of 12 Block 1 (9-1/2" square unfinished).



Block 1 - Make 12

Shading of diagrams may vary depending on fabrics used.

3. In the same manner, make 6 Block 2 with fabrics indicated.



Block 2 - Make 6

4. In the same manner, make 10 Block 3 with 2 **Fabric C** 3-1/2" marked squares and a **Fabric B** 3-1/2" x 9-1/2" piece (3-1/2" x 9-1/2" unfinished).



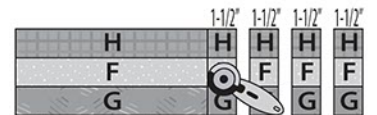
Block 3 - Make 10

5. Sew 1 each **Fabrics C** and **D** 3-7/8" triangles together along their long edges. Make a total of 4 Unit 1 (3-1/2" square unfinished).

6. Stitch a **Fabric F** 1-1/2" strip lengthwise between 1-1/2" **Fabrics G**

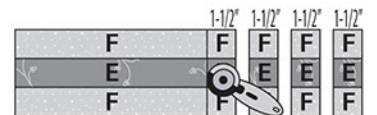


Make 2 Strip Sets

Cut 34 Unit 2a

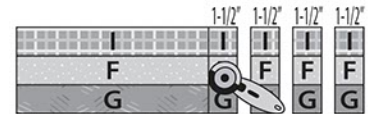
and **H** strips. Make a second strip set. From these, cut (34) 1-1/2" wide Unit 2a (1-1/2" x 3-1/2" unfinished).

7. In the same manner, make the number of strips sets to cut the required number of Units 2b-2f with fabrics indicated.



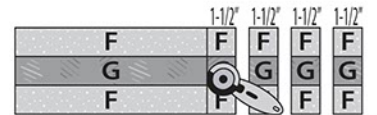

Cut 17 Unit 2b



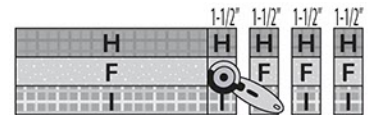

Cut 96 Unit 2c



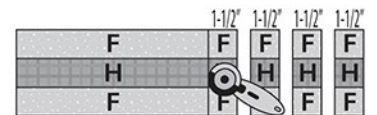

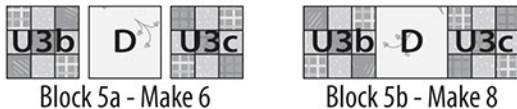
8. Stitch a Unit 2b between 2 Unit 2a as shown. Make a total of 17 Unit 3a (3-1/2" square unfinished). In the same manner, make 48 each Units



9. Arrange 4 **Fabric D** 3-1/2" squares, 1 Unit 3a, 2 Unit 3b, and 2 Unit 3c in 3 rows as shown. Stitch into rows. Sew rows together. Make a total of 17 Block 4 (9-1/2" square unfinished).



10. Sew a **Fabric D** 3-1/2" square between 1 each Unit 3b and Unit 3c as shown. Make a total of 6 Block 5a and 8 Block 5b (3-1/2" x 9-1/2" unfinished) noting rotation of units.



11. Refer to Quilt Layout (Page 3) for arrangement and placement of units, blocks, and borders.

12. Arrange units and blocks in 9 rows. Stitch into rows. Stitch rows together.

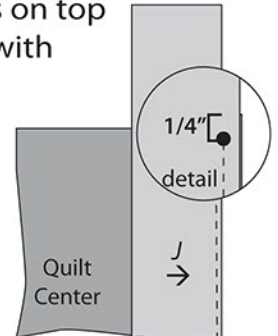
2. Finishing (Version 1 only):

1. The quilt measures approximately 51-1/2" x 69-1/2" (unfinished). Make backing (**Fabric K**) approximately 8" larger than the top.

2. Layer and baste top, batting, and backing together. Quilt as desired. Attach binding (**Fabric E**) and enjoy!!

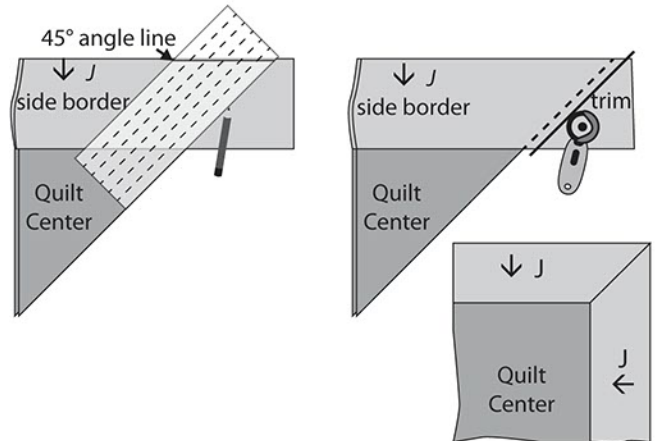
2. Border & Finishing (Version 2 only):

1. Center **Fabric J** 8-3/4" x 90" borders on right and left sides of quilt center and **Fabric J** 8-3/4" x 72" borders on top and bottom of quilt center with the leaf stripe next to quilt center. Stitch borders to sides starting and stopping 1/4" from corners of quilt center. Do not trim. Press borders out.



*Letters in italics indicate wrong side of fabric.
Arrows indicate orientation of directional prints.*

2. Working with 1 corner at a time, fold the quilt right sides together so the outside edges of the borders line up. Using a 45-degree ruler, mark from the end of border seams to outer edges of borders. Stitch along marked line. Trim seam allowance to 1/4". Press corner seam open. Repeat on remaining corners.



3. The quilt measures approximately 68" x 86" (unfinished). Make backing (**Fabric K**) approximately 8" larger than the top.

4. Layer and baste top, batting, and backing together. Quilt as desired. Attach binding (**Fabric E**) and enjoy!!
