

A deceptively simple slip stitch cowl with an i-cord edge. A great way to show off pretty yarn in contrasting colors.

## Materials

Madeline Tosh Farm Twist DK

1 skein each of 2 colors with contrast, 100g each

US8/5mm needles

Darning needle

Size when finished: 11" wide x 40" around.

*This is long enough to loop around twice snugly; there should be enough yarn to make it longer if you wish.*

## Instructions

*Note, this pattern uses 2 colors of yarn, and switches between them every two rows. I personally get confused as to which is the "main color" and which is the "contrast color" in knitting patterns, so I am going to call the colors "dark" and "light".*

With dark yarn: CO 48

Row 1 (dark): k3, \*sl 1 purlwise, k2, repeat from \* until 3 sts rem, sl3 wyif.

Row 2: K all stitches until 3 sts rem, sl3 wyif.

Row 3 (light): k3, \*k2, sl 1 purlwise, repeat from \* until 3 sts rem, sl3 wyif.

Row 4: K all stitches until 3 sts rem, sl3 wyif.

Repeat rows 1 - 4 until piece measures 40" or desired length, ending with row 3.

BO all stitches (in light yarn), seam cast on and bind off edges together, weave in ends.



## Abbreviations

- K: knit
- P: purl
- sl: slip stitch
- st(s): stitch(es)
- CO: cast on
- BO: bind off
- rem: remain(ing)
- st(s): stitch(es)
- wyif: with yarn held at the front of the work
