# **Quilt Challenges and Competitions**

## **Quilt Competitions**

This week we have thought a lot about quilting competitions and quilting challenges. Why do people participate in them? Sue Hickman recently discussed on a visit to the store her Hoffman Challenge submission and acceptance in the Cherrywood Challenge. Sue has been quilting for over 40 years, and as a fiber artist, she likes participating in challenges and contests as they encourage her to think outside the box and try something new. She doesn't participate in all of them; they need to call her and speak to her creative spirit. When participating in these, she's excited to try new things, whether a new technique or a new use of material.

Susanne Miller Jones has curated three collections published in a series of books. Each collection centered around a specific theme. The quilts selected and published in these books celebrated these themes and were individual interpretations of the themes. Susanne's books are available for purchase <a href="here">here</a>. As you explore the quilts featured in each of these books, you see how each artist interpreted the theme and created a work of art to depict the theme.

We are fortunate to have Kerry Faraone work with us at Webfabrics, another accomplished art quilter featured in many of these books. Every day someone walks through our door seeking fabric and inspiration for a new project. Sometimes these challenges help someone break through a quilting slump by pushing them to try something new. This week we were excited to meet Elizabeth and her grandmother, Lee. Elizabeth was here buying fabric for the Hoffman challenge - she's entering the new youth category. We also talked with another customer Saturday and saw her Hoffman challenge quilt. It's always impressive to see our customers' ideas and finished projects.

Challenges come from a variety of places. When we traveled to the AQS QuiltWeek in Paducah, KY, we happened upon a long tradition from a group who travel there every year and stay in the same hotel. Each year someone provides a fat quarter of the challenge fabric, and everyone who wants to participate can pick one up. The rules are simple, use that challenge fabric in a piece and bring it back next year to share with the group on the show and tell night at the hotel. The fabric can't be in the binding or backing. The completed project can be anything - it doesn't have to be a quilt. We all picked up a piece and will make something for next year. We are already thinking about how we will use this fabric. What do we see in this fabric? How would we use it? Each piece will be as unique as the individual making it. That's the challenge, push yourself to get out of your comfort zone and be creative. There is no right or wrong - it's your interpretation of that fabric and how you want to use it.

## What is a Quilt Challenge?

A quilt challenge is an event or activity where participants are given specific guidelines or themes to create their unique quilts. Here are some of the critical benefits of a quilt challenge:

- 1. Creativity and Skill Development: Quilt challenges encourage participants to think outside the box and develop creative solutions to meet the challenge requirements. It allows them to try new techniques, experiment with different fabrics, and push the boundaries of their quilting skills.




# QuiltCon 2024 Community Outreach Challenge

creations are examples of possible artwork you might enter, but you must use all or part of your fat quarter in your piece. (Buy your fat quarter from Webfabrics and sign up to participate, then submit your piece to receive a coupon worth \$5.00 off on your next in-store purchase.)

This challenge exhibit is sponsored by the Friends of Franklin Park Arts Center in partnership with Webfabrics and cash prizes and a surprise 'swaq' bag from Webfabrics will be awarded.

## Ravel by eBond for FreeSpirit Fabrics

This is e Bond's third collection. She says: "Working on RAVEL was an amazing opportunity to continue my visual exploration into shapes. I focused on the modern Roman alphabet (aka the 26 letterforms from A—Z) as the primary shapes for this collection. RAVEL became a collection of prints about these shapes coming together and falling apart. While creating, my main questions circled a.) How can I break letters apart into new, interesting forms and b.) Is it possible to obscure these already imbued symbols so much that they 'lose' meaning? The letterforms in RAVEL run the gamut from clear and legible to fractured and finally to some forms completely disintegrating into their environments. According to Merriam-Webster, a contronym is a word with two meanings contradicting one another. Hence, finding the word 'ravel' was perfect for bringing all these ideas together in a collection form. Ravel means both tangle and untangle, which is a wonderful way to think about these visual shapes in space."








Row by Row has started and runs from June 1 - August 31, 2023. We created two designs that are available for purchase in-store and online.

- **Sew I Wine** celebrates Loudoun County. On our drive to the store, we pass cows and numerous vineyards, so this plate depicts those views.
- **Surf the Web** celebrates the long history of Webfabrics as an online business. We wanted to keep the summer theme and include our cow in both designs.

Kits can be ordered online or picked up in-store. License plates are available in two sizes; 4" x 7" and a mini which is 2" x 4". Both designs have an optional panel for purchase. Sew I Wine's panel is a little license plate for the tractor and a barn quilt for the barn. Surf the Webs panel is the computer screen.
