

# **Stripology Rulers**

A new Stripology Ruler has arrived.

The **Stripology® Quarters Mini** is one of the smallest rulers in the Stripology® series of rulers. Designed to work with units



up to 6-1/4in, you'll be able to cut 1/4in and 1/8in increments as well.

- Easy to read black and white markings.
- Whole inch, half inch, quarter inch, and eighth inch increments are included.
- Markings for 1/4in and 3/4in cuts are included with cutting slots every 1/4in.
- Turn the ruler around and use the black and white squares to square up blocks in 1/4in increments up to 6-1/4in.
- Use the 45 degree lines to trim flying geese units down to 1/4in increments.
- 1-1/2in cuts are highlighted with black stars.
- Great for fussy cutting and trimming embroidered blocks. The flexibility of the ruler adjusts for the thickness of the embroidery giving you an accurate trim.
- Comes with fully illustrated step by step instructions.
- Scan the QR Code printed on the instructions to view a howto video of these features and to see the patterns that can be made with this ruler.
- Ruler slides easily over the fabric until pressure is applied. Then our exclusive grip holds the fabric in place while cutting, eliminating slipping and miss-cuts.

Total Size – 8-1/2in x 12-1/2in Alternating Slits are 8in and 9-1/2in long.



Giuseppe, born and raised in New York, now resides in New England. He is an avid modern traditionalist quilter with a great passion for simple design in bright colors.


Are you a fan of true crime podcasts like Sydney? If so this collection along with the others in this series may appeal to you. Here's what Giucy has to say about this collection.

But then I got to thinking... What if I build the lore a bit and create a series of groups that lead up to a quilting themed true crime collection, one where all the designs tie together? That's how the tales of Fabric from the Attic, Fabric from the Basement, and Sleuth were born!

As a designer I really want to try to do something different with my fabric collections. I hope that with my designs I give a voice to all the weirdos out there like me who want to sew with something a little unexpected. I feel so lucky to be able to design for a company like @andoverfabrics who never limit my creativity. I don't think another company would let me release a group like this, so it means more to me than you know to be able to put this out into the world. This collection may not be everyone's cup of tea but no one can take away the pride I feel putting something different out there. After all, I know I'm not the only one listening to grizzly serial killer podcasts while I lovingly stitch together my quilt tops!"

# **Coming Soon**







#### **Pouch Club Series**



The July Pouch project is available. Order your Sunflower Pattern or a complete kit with fabric, zipper, pattern and interfacing to make your own.



# Row by Row 2023

Row by Row has started and runs from June 1 - August 31, 2023. We created two designs that are available for purchase in-store and online.

- **Sew I Wine** celebrates Loudoun County. On our drive to the store, we pass cows and numerous vineyards, so this plate depicts those views.
- **Surf the Web** celebrates the long history of Webfabrics as an online business. We wanted to keep the summer theme and include our cow in both designs.

Kits can be ordered online or picked up in-store. License plates are available in two sizes; 4" x 7" and a mini which is 2" x 4". Both designs have an optional panel for purchase. Sew I Wine's panel is a little license plate for the tractor and a barn quilt for the barn. Surf the Webs panel is the computer screen.
