<p>Step 1—</p> <p>Hoop <u>lightweight tearaway stabilizer</u>. Place <u>water soluble thread</u> in the needle and <u>embroidery bobbin thread</u> in the bobbin. Sew placement.</p>					
<p>Step 2—</p> <p>Align prepared <u>HOOPShape™</u> in placement stitching and tack down using the <u>same thread</u>.</p>					
<p>Step 3—</p> <p>Align <u>Front Fabric</u> over placement stitch and sew tack down using the <u>same thread</u>.</p>					
<p>Step 4—</p> <p>Turn off your automatic thread cutter.</p> <p>Sew quilting using <u>thread color of your choice</u>.</p>					
<p>Trim ¼" from basting stitch on all edges of each section of the stocking.</p>					



Stitch the blocks together in the provided layout. Press all seams in one direction.



- Choose a decorative stitch to sew over the seam lines. Use the same color thread as all other stitching.
- Cut the back for stocking—Use the stocking as the pattern, place front of completed stocking *right side* to the stocking backing fabric. Cut out one stocking back.
- Cut the lining for stocking—Place the two remaining large pieces of Backing Fabric right sides together. Use the stocking as a pattern and cut out two pieces for lining.

- Keeping stocking back and front right sides together, place them on the large piece of HOOPShape™. Use a walking foot to stitch the front to the back, leaving the top open. Stitch just to the outside of the last basting stitch. Trim the Soft and Stable even with the stocking, clip the curves, turn and press.
- Stitch the two lining stockings right sides together, using a 3/8 inch seam allowance and leaving the top open. *Do not turn!*
- Slip the lining into the stocking. Pin the top edge and baste closed.
- Press the 2½" x width of fabric piece of Backing Fabric wrong sides together the long way. Trim off 8" for the loop for hanging the stocking.
- Create the loop for hanging the stocking—Open 8" piece of binding fabric and press the raw edges to meet in the middle. Press in half again, raw edges sandwiched in the middle. Top stitch the loop. Pin it to the outside edge of the seam at the back of the stocking.
- Bind the top edge, then top stitch loop in place so that it stands up for hanging.
