

Mystery Quilt 2020

Week 6

Cut:

Color D – 1 – 9 ½" square – **D5**
4 – 5" squares – **D6**

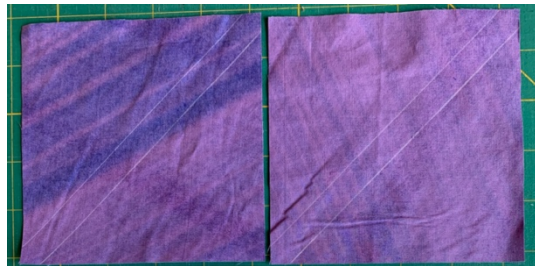
Color E – 2 – 9 ½" squares – **E5**
8 – 5" squares – **E6**

Color F – 1 – 9 ½" square – **F5**
4 – 5" squares – **F6**

Background – 4 – 9 ½" squares – **BK9**
16 – 5" squares – **BK10**

1. On the wrong side of all **D6**, **E6**, **F6** and **BK10** squares, mark a line ¼" away from both sides of one diagonal.

2. Gather two **D6** squares and one **BK9** square. Place the **D6** squares on opposite corners, nudging in just a few threads. They will overlap in the center. Stitch just inside both marked lines.

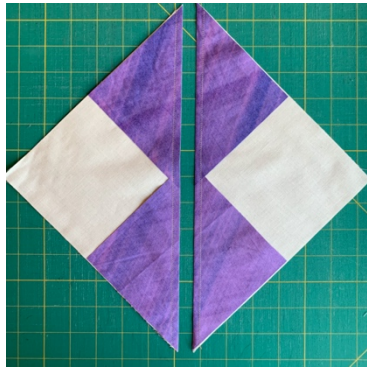

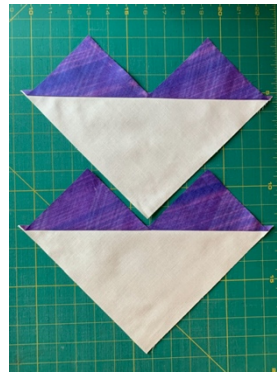


3. Cut between the marked lines. Press toward the small triangles. Don't they look like hearts? 😊

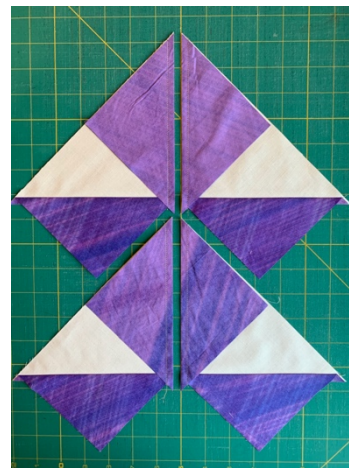


4. Gather the remaining **D6** squares and place them in the open corners of the large triangles, nudging in a few threads as before. Stitch just inside both marked lines, making sure to start stitching at the corner both times. Cut between the marked lines. Press toward small triangles.

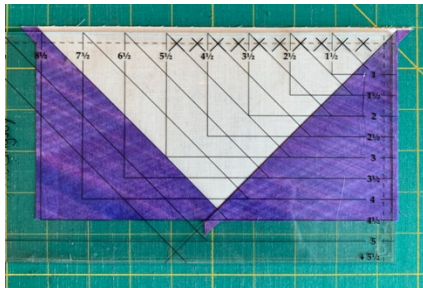

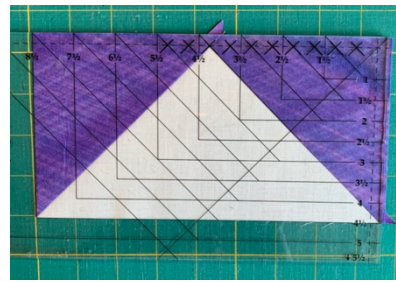


- Trim the four Flying Geese to $8\frac{1}{2}'' \times 4\frac{1}{2}''$. I used the Wing Clipper 1 by Studio 180. It makes the trimming soooo much easier, but you can certainly use whatever you have to make an accurate unit.

- Gather two **BK9** squares and the eight **E6** squares. Repeat steps 2-5 to yield 8 Flying Geese.
- Gather the remaining **BK9** square and four **F6** squares. Repeat steps 2-5 to yield 4 Flying Geese.
- Now we will make the reverse colorways of the geese you already made. Gather the one **D5** square and four **BK10** squares and repeat steps 2-5 to yield 4 Flying Geese.
- Gather the two **E5** squares and eight **BK10** squares. Repeat steps 2-5 to yield 8 Flying Geese.
- Gather one **F5** square and the four remaining **BK10** squares. Repeat steps 2-5 to yield 4 Flying Geese.
- You should now have:
 - 4 **D/BK** and 4 reverse **BK/D**
 - 8 **E/BK** and 8 reverse **BK/E**
 - 4 **F/BK** and 4 reverse **BK/F**
- Stitch one **D/BK** and one reverse **BK/D** together to make an "arrow". The color should create the arrow. Press seams open. Repeat with all of the flying geese, stitching the same colors together.



Yield: 4 – **D/BK** arrows
 8 – **E/BK** arrows
 4 – **F/BK** arrows
