
Block #7

1. Cut fabric as shown.



2. Small Half-Square Triangles – Gather the two 6" background squares, the 6" contrast square and the 6" main square. On the wrong side of the two background squares, mark a diagonal line ¼" away from both sides of the diagonal. I used my Quilter's Magic Wand for accurate line, but use whatever tool you may have. Repeat this for the other diagonal. Stitch on, or just inside all of the marked lines.









 Cut each square into eight sections, starting with the VERTICAL and HORIZONTAL cuts first. Position ruler at 3" mark vertically, then horizontally. Do not move the square. Then cut both diagonals. Press seams open.



Diagonal Cuts




Horizontal Cut







4. Trim to 2 1/2". I use the Tucker Trimmer 1 for easy, accurate cuts, but use whatever you have on hand.








5. Assemble four corner units as shown. You will have 4 background/main halfsquare triangle units left over.



6. Square in a Square units. Gather the four 3 3/8" main color squares and the sixteen background triangles. Stitch a triangle to opposite sides of the square. Just basically center it and sew with the square on the top for better visibility. Press away from the center.






7. Repeat with remaining two sides.








8. Trim all four units to 4 1/2" taking care to leave 1/4" between center square point and the outside edge. Of course, I used my Tucker Trimmer 1 again!! ©



9. Assemble block as shown. Press seams open. It should measure $12 \frac{1}{2}$ ".
