

House Setting Block – 12" x 12" finished



This setting block uses the 6 ½" block you have already made. You will need 5 different fabrics: background, chimney, roof, house and door. The measurements will be the same for every setting block with the largest piece being 12 ½" x 3 ½". It is a great scrappy project! I cut out all of my house pieces out ahead of time, then picked the combinations I liked best with my 6 ½" block.

For each house setting block:

Cut: **A - Background:** 1 – 1 ½" x 12 ½" rectangle – **A1**
 2 – 2 ½" x 3 ½" rectangles – **A2**
 1 – 2 ½" x 2 ½" square – **A3**
 2 – 3 ½" x 3 ½" squares – **A4**

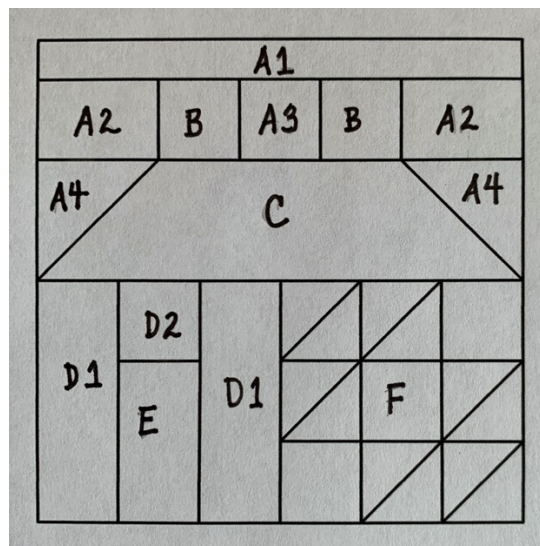
B - Chimney: 2 – 2 ½" x 2 ½" squares – **B**

C - Roof: 1 – 3 ½" x 12 ½" rectangle – **C**

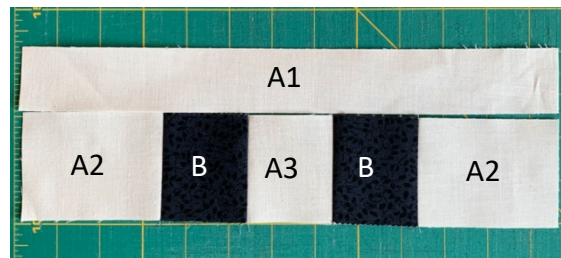
D - House: 2 – 2 ½" x 6 ½" rectangles – **D1**
 1 – 2 ½" x 2 ½" square – **D2**

E - Door: 1 – 2 ½" x 4 ½" rectangle – **E**

One Twisted Tradition 6 ½" block - **F**



1. Stitch **A2 + B + A3 + B + A2** into one long row using $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam. Then stitch that completed row to piece **A1**. Press toward piece **A1**.



2. Gather both **A4** pieces and mark one diagonal line, corner to corner on each piece. Stitch these pieces to **C** being careful to position them as shown. Stitch just outside the marked lines.



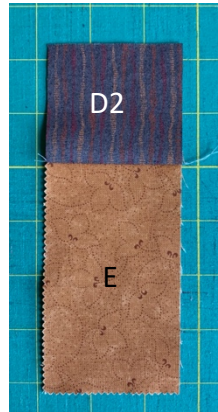
3. Trim the seams to $\frac{1}{4}$ ". Press to the background.



4. Stitch the roof to the upper section. Press seams to roof or press open.



5. Stitch piece **D2** (house) to top of **E** (door) as shown. Press to the darker fabric.



6. Stitch an **D1** + door section + **D1** + **6 ½"** block as shown. Press seams to **D1** pieces.



7. Stitch the completed section to the roof section. Press seam to roof or press open.
