## Rolling Stone $-61 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ unfinished



1. Cut fabric as directed. Just a quick FYI, the A1 square MUST be $\mathbf{1 1 5 / 1 6 " \text { ". It doesn't seem like }}$ $1 / 16^{\prime \prime}$ would matter that much, but it does. Just make your cut halfway between the $17 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ and 2" mark on your ruler. I starched the fabric before I cut to give me a little more stability. It's only 4 squares!! :) If you have the Square Squared tool by Studio 180, just cut on the side that says center square cut size for a 2 " block. It will be the perfect size.

Background: 4-1 15/16" x 1 15/16" squares - A1
$1-1 \frac{1}{2} / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 12^{\prime \prime}$ strip - A2
$1-21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square - A3
Contrast: $\quad 8-2 \frac{1 / 4 \prime \prime}{} \times 2 \frac{1}{4 \prime \prime}$ squares - B1
$1-1 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 12^{\prime \prime}$ strip - B2

2. Gather the eight $\mathbf{B 2}$ squares and cut them in half diagonally. Stitch a B1 triangle to opposite sides of the $\mathbf{A 1}$ squares. Basically center the pieces and stitch with the square on top for better visibility. Press to the triangles.

3. Stitch the remaining B1 triangles to the other opposite sides of A1. Again, basically center the pieces and stitch with the square on top for better visibility. Press toward the triangles.

4. Trim these four squares to $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$. Be careful to leave $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ between the points of the squares and the outside edges. I used my Square Squared tool again for perfect placement.

5. Gather the $\mathbf{A} \mathbf{2}$ and the $\mathbf{B 2}$ strip and stitch them together along the long edge using a scant $1 / 4$ seam. Press open and then measure across to make sure it is $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$. Subcut into $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ sections.

5. Gather the $\mathbf{A} \mathbf{3}$ square and assemble the block as shown. Press all seams open. Now you are ready for the setting block! $)$
