## Serger Organizer Pad

It is always a great idea to keep your most used tools close to your machine. You will never have to go search for those tools right in the middle of a project. This pad is more than a place to keep your favorite tools. It will also help to reduce vibrations even on the fastest speeds

This awesome organizer pad can be made for any size machine. The included measurements are based on the Baby Lock Triumph serger.



## **Supplies:**

Approximate yardage

2/3 yard fabric for backing (A)

1/2 yard focus fabric for top side (B)

1/4 yard focus fabric for pocket (C)

1/4 yard solid fabric for inside pocket (D)

1/3 yards binding fabric (E)

5-10 coordinating jelly roll strips (F)

\*\*Most pieces can easily use scraps from your stash

1 yard 1/4" ribbon

2/3 yard quilt batting

30"x 45" double sided fusible Bosal R form

4 cones of matching serger thread for body construction

4-8 sppols of 12wt coordinating and/or contracting thread for decorative stitching

Marking pen/Chalk Marker

Standard foot

P5 Cording foot

Chain Cover foot

Narrow Belt Binder

It is always a good idea to bring all of your serger feet.

## Cutting

**NOTE:** Pre Cutting your fabric will allow more face-to-face learning and sharing of tips & tricks.

Fabric A (backing) 28"x28"

Fabric B\* (focus fabric for top) 3 strips - all 28" long --> 3", 5" 10"

Fabric C\* (front of pocket) 7"x 30"

Fabric D (inside of pocket) 2 strips – 7"x28"

Fabric E (binding) continuous strip 2.5"x120"

Fabric F to be cut into 28" strips to intertwined into the focus fabric for the top

\*For more interest feel free use your imagination to piece as many different fabrics from your stash to make achieve final dimensions for each piece.

**NOTE:** The supplies and cutting list make a cover about 20" x 30" so if your measurements are larger, you will need to add more fabric to the width to make it fit or more techniques and cut fabric accordingly.
