



Class: Villa Rosa Club – January 2026 – Sweater Weather

Class Fee: \$50

Skill Level: Easy

Items needed for class must be purchased from The Cotton Blossom (fabric, patterns, rulers, books, specialty thread, etc). If you have basic sewing supplies and they are not listed below, please bring those (pins, scissors, seam ripper, needles, thread, etc.).

Class Description: Welcome to the club! If you finish your top from the previous month – you will receive this months pattern for FREE! Sweater Weather is a 2 color quilt that is just stunning. You'll use yardage and make a quilt perfect for snuggling under in the coldest months! Have you ever wanted to make a top with only solids? Here's your chance!

SUPPLIES:

Sweater Weather Villa Rosa Pattern (if you completed Decembers quilt top you'll receive this on class day)

1 ½ yards White (or color of choice for stars and checks)

3 ¼ yards background and border

¾ yard for a traditional binding

OR ½ yard each of flange and outer binding for faux flange binding

Stripology XL or Squared are highly recommended for cutting your fabric.

4 ½" or larger Bloc Loc ruler OR a similar sized square ruler to be used for squaring up the HSTs

Marking utensil (Madame Sew Pen, Pencil, Water erasable pen, etc)

Rotary Cutter

Fresh blade

Cutting mat (a rotating mat is great for what we'll be working on)

Thread

Clips/Pins/Snips

HOMEWORK

From White, cut:

5 – 5" WOF – Subcut into 36 – 5"x5" squares.

You will have a piece left. Use this to cut 4 – 4 ½" x 4 ½" squares.

4 – 4 ½" WOF – Subcut into 32 – 4 ½" x 4 ½" squares.

You will end up with a total of 36 – 4 ½" x 4 ½" squares.

5 – 2 ½" WOF – Subcut one strip into 9 – 2 ½" squares.

Keep the other strips as they are.

From Background, cut:

5 – 5" WOF – Subcut into 36 – 5"x5" squares.

You will have a piece left. Use this to cut 4 – 4 ½" x 4 ½" squares.

4 – 4 ½" WOF – Subcut into 32 – 4 ½" x 4 ½" squares.

You will end up with a total of 36 – 4 ½" x 4 ½" squares.

4 – 2 ½" WOF

2 – 8 ½" WOF – Subcut into 32 – 2 ½" x 8 ½" pieces

1 – 2 ½" WOF – Subcut into 4 – 2 ½" x 8 ½" pieces

You will end up with 36 – 2 ½" x 8 ½" pieces

3 – 2 ½" WOF – Subcut into 6 – 2 ½" x 18 ½" pieces

13 – 2 ½" WOF (these will be used for your border)

The Cotton Blossom Fabric Shoppe Class Policy:

- 1) To reserve a spot in a class you must pre-register in store or online. All fees are required at time of registration.
- 2) Most classes require supplies in addition to the instruction fee.
- 3) Typically, there is not enough time prior to class to shop for the class, so we ask that you purchase all fabric and supplies at least one day prior to class.
- 4) Basic sewing supplies will be needed for each class. * Supplies specific to the class must be purchased from The Cotton Blossom (fabric, books, rulers). A supply list will be available at registration. Our expertise in coordinating fabrics and selecting proper tools is part of your lesson before class starts.
- 5) You must cancel more than 7 days prior to class for a refund (your choice of a refund or store credit). If you are unable to make class and you cancel within 7 days of the class, the class fee is non-refundable. However, we are happy to offer a spot in another class with the same instructor later.
- 6) Most classes have a minimum enrollment (usually 3 students). If the class is cancelled due to low enrollment, you will be notified & all course fees will be returned in full (your choice of a refund or store credit).
- 7) Patterns, books, and handouts cannot be shared or photo-copied due to copyright laws.
- 8) Guests are not allowed in the classroom.
- 9) All machine brands are welcome in our classroom.
- 10) A limited number of classroom machines are available for use. Please indicate at the time of registration if you'd like to use one of our machines.
- 11) Your Sewing Machine must be in good working order, and you need to know how to thread it and operate it (except when noted in beginner sewing class). It is suggested that if you have not used your machine in a while, you should have it serviced. We do not recommend "borrowing one from a friend who hasn't used it for years!" Our teachers cannot use valuable class time to try and repair or figure out how to operate it. If you have unforeseen problems with your machine during class, we are happy to let you borrow one of our machines when available.

*BASIC SEWING SUPPLIES: Scissors, pins, seam ripper, pen, paper, needles, thread, ruler, and thread. If you have supplies at home, bring them. Specialty items needed for class (pattern, book, fabric, ruler) must be purchased at The Cotton Blossom. Please make every effort to make supply purchases prior to class.
