• Quilt from Mom's Favorite Fabrics

- **Signature Quilt**

A signature quilt is a beautiful way to create a lasting tribute from a group of people who admire a mother or mother figure. This quilt can be made by gathering signatures and messages from friends and family, and each block tells a part of the person's story. In my quilt shop, I've seen these quilts bring people together in celebration, especially for women who have touched many lives. These non-traditional moms may not have children of their own, but they've shared their nurturing wisdom with all of us.

- **Garden Quilt**

A garden quilt can be a perfect tribute to any woman who loves nature and nurturing. Each flower can represent a different quality of the person, whether it's her strength, her creativity, or her compassion. For many of us quilters, the women who've supported and guided us may have been teachers, friends, or other quilters who never had children of their own, but they still helped us grow. I made a garden quilt as a tribute to all the women who have nurtured me along the way, using flowers to symbolize each of the qualities they've shared with me.
