



Traditional Log Cabin Supply List

The beauty of the Traditional Log Cabin block lies in its versatility. Using the Tucker Trimmer® III ensures precise piecing, whether you're creating a single stunning block or an entire quilt. Fabric requirements will vary depending on the size of the block you choose and the scale of your finished project. Before gathering your materials, decide how large you'd like your blocks and quilt to be, and use this guide to estimate fabric needs accordingly.

Choosing Fabrics for a Traditional Log Cabin Quilt

The Traditional Log Cabin block is a timeless design, offering endless opportunities to showcase color and contrast. When selecting fabrics, think about the overall look you want to achieve. Classic Log Cabins often feature a high-contrast arrangement, with light fabrics on one side and dark fabrics on the other, creating a striking visual effect. Consider using a variety of prints and textures within your light and dark groups for added depth and interest. Whether you opt for a traditional palette, a bold modern twist, or a scrappy assortment from your stash, the Log Cabin is a perfect canvas for creative expression.

For our class we will create (9) 12" blocks. You will need the following:

Center: (1) 2 ½" x WOF

Placement	Fabric A (Light)	Fabric B (Light)	Fabric C (Dark)	Fabric D (Dark)
Round 1	(1) 1 ¾" x WOF	(1) 1 ¾" x WOF	(1) 1 ¾" x WOF	(2) 1 ¾" x WOF
