## Evergreen Fern Class Supply List

Pre-cutting the fabrics is a mandatory requirement prior to taking this class. Please begin preparing for class several weeks in advance to make sure that you are familiar with your pattern and can complete the pre-cutting before arriving.

<u>Fabric Selection:</u> Please refer to the yardage on the back of your pattern for the required fabric amounts.

Please Note: On the second to last page there is a diagram showing

where each fabric is located within the quilt. Please use this diagram when picking out fabrics; it will help you with color placement.

<u>Preparing your Foundation Papers:</u> Please read and follow the instructions for "Foundation Papers and Template Sheets" on page 2.

Note: PLEASE PAY SPECIAL ATTENTION THAT YOU DO NOT CONFUSE FOUNDATION PAPERS WITH TEMPLATE LAYOUT SHEETS.

- Foundation Papers: These are the foundations that you will sew the fabric directly onto. These need to be trimmed leaving a 1/8' border. Do not cut the individual units apart.
- Template Layout Sheets: The template layout sheets are used to cut your fabric. You will cut through these templates when you cut certain parts of your fabric. These need to be trimmed leaving a 1/16" border and used per the directions in the pattern.
- Templates: The templates are also used to cut your fabric. Unlike template layout sheets where you don't have to be exact when cutting out your fabric using them, with templates you must be exact when cutting out your fabric.

The following items will be used in class:

- Sewing Machine with a Quarter-inch foot
- Medium Size Cutting Mat (a nice size is 18"x 24")
- Rotary Cutter
- Size 70 Needles
- Glue Pen (Fons & Porter, Sewline or Avery)
- Scissors
- Seam Ripper
- 12" Add-a-Quarter Ruler
- Glue Stick (UHU is the brand I use, but any washable glue will work, like an Elmer's Washable Glue Stick)
- Purple Thang (Optional)
- Ruler (please bring a ruler for cutting fabric, a nice size is a 15"x 15" ruler)
- High Quality Cotton Sewing Thread
- Pattern
- Pins (Judy recommends flower pins, but any pin that you prefer would be fine).
- Paper Clips (Any type of clip that you can use to clip stacks of fabric together will be fine.)
- Ziploc Bags (1 gallon size or 2 gallon size)

### Fabric Requirements for Evergreen Fern

Before cutting any fabric, I would start by labeling three plastic Ziploc bags with the following labels:

# Group J Bag, Group G Bag, and Group B

#### **Group J: Wind Spinner Cutting Instructions**

glue fabric swatch here	Fabric J1 $\left(\frac{1}{4} yard\right)$	• Cut (1) 6" by 42" strip and label it J1 and place into the bag labeled Bag J Group.
glue fabric swatch here	Fabric J2 $\left(\frac{3}{8} \ yard\right)$	• Cut (2) 6" by 42" strips and label them J2 and place them into the bag labeled Bag J Group.
glue fabric swatch here	Fabric J3 $\left(\frac{3}{8} yard\right)$	• Cut (2) 6" by 42" strips and label them J3 and place them into the bag labeled Bag J Group.
glue fabric swatch here	Fabric J4 $\left(\frac{3}{4} \text{ yard}\right)$	Cut (4) 6" by 42" strips and label them J4 and place them into the bag labeled Bag J Group
glue fabric swatch here	Fabric J5 $\left(\frac{1}{2} yard\right)$	Cut (2) 7" by 42" strips and label them J5 and place them into the bag labeled Bag J Group

#### **Group G: Pineapple Blossom Border Cutting Instructions**

glue fabric swatch here	Fabric G1 $\left(1\frac{1}{2} yard\right)$	• Cut (4) 13" by 42" strips and label them G1 and place into the bag labeled Bag G Group
glue fabric swatch here	Fabric G2 $\left(\frac{1}{4} yard\right)$	• Cut (4) $1\frac{3}{4}$ " by 42" strip and label them G2 and place into the bag labeled Bag G Group
glue fabric swatch here	Fabric G3 $\left(\frac{1}{8} yard\right)$	• Cut (2) 2" by 42" strips and label them G3 and place them into the bag labeled Bag G Group
glue fabric swatch here	Fabric G4 $\left(\frac{1}{8} yard\right)$	• Cut (2) 2" by 42" strips and label them G4 and place into the bag labeled Bag G Group

glue fabric swatch here	Fabric G5 $\left(\frac{1}{8} yard\right)$	• Cut (2) 2" by 42" strips and label them G5 and place into the bag labeled Bag G Group
glue fabric swatch here	Fabric G6 $\left(\frac{1}{8} yard\right)$	<ul> <li>Cut (2) 6" by 42" strips and label them G6 and place into the bag labeled Bag G Group</li> </ul>
glue fabric swatch here	Fabric G7 $\left(\frac{1}{8} yard\right)$	• Cut (1) 3" by 42" strip and label it G7 and place into the bag labeled Bag G Group
glue fabric swatch here	Fabric G8 $\left(\frac{1}{8} yard\right)$	<ul> <li>Cut (1) 2<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> " by 42" strip and label</li> <li>it G8 and place into the bag labeled</li> <li>Bag G Group</li> </ul>
