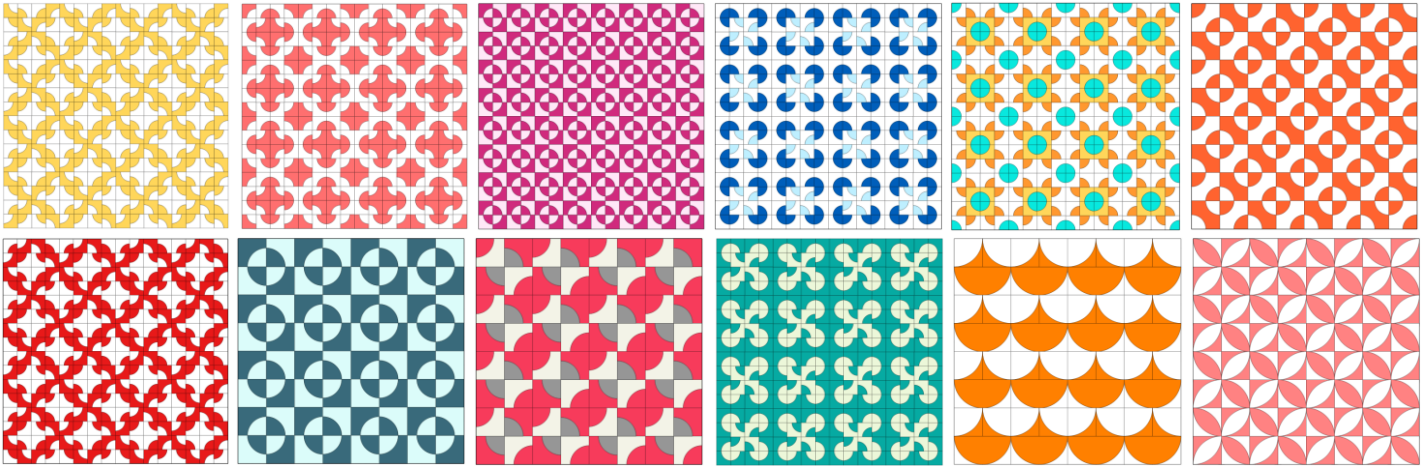


April 2020 Sewing Bingo – Curved Piecing with Kim

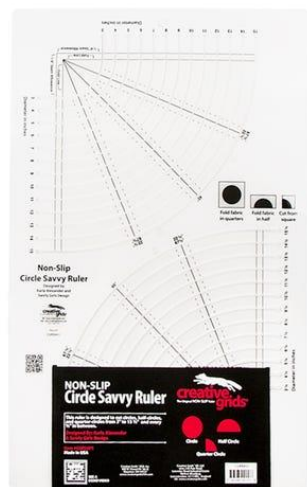


Have you tried curved piecing yet? It is time to challenge yourself. It's not hard, but it's not easy until you play with some curves. Let's get to sewing.

What do you need to know?

- Stitch slowly because of the bias seams, and you have a chance to line up your edges to sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance.
- Just pin in three places, the middle, the beginning and the end. There are videos out where people use glue, but, try the three pins first.
- There are some great tutorials on-line, just check them out.
- The number of rotary cutting templates are too many to mention, but I have the [Creative Grids Circle Savvy Ruler CGRSAV1](#), which I love because with this one ruler I can cut a full circle, half circle and quarter circles.
- You could also make your blocks with improv methods, go online and type, "improv curved piecing" into your search engine and be amazed.
- Get some fabric out and try curved piecing. As you can see above there are many patterns for you to try and more that we have shown here. Start sewing some blocks.

6" (finished) Drunkards Patch for you to try. Use this to make templates out of freezer paper or a plastic template sheet. When you print, make sure the measurement of the outside cutting lines measures 6 1/2".
