B (20) $13 / 4$ " $\times 3$ " rectangles
C (20) $13 / 4$ " squares
From each of 4 dark prints cut:
D (10) $13 / 4$ " squares

## Block 2 Cutting Instructions

From the light print cut:
E (8) $13 / 4$ " $\times 3$ " rectangles
F (8) 2 1/2" squares
G (32) $13 / 4$ " squares
From each of 4 dark prints cut:
H (4) $13 / 4$ " $\times 3$ " rectangles
J (2) $21 / 2$ " squares
K (2) $13 / 4$ " squares

## Cutting Instructions for the rest of the quilt

From a dark print cut:
Border 1:

(2) $11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 151 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ inside side borders
(2) $11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 171 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ inside top and bottom borders

From the light print cut:
Border 2:

(2) 3 3/4" $\times 241 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ outside top and bottom borders
(2) $33 / 4$ " $\times 171 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ outside side borders

## Block 1

## Making the Flying Geese Units

- Using a pencil, draw a straight line from corner to corner on the wrong side of a dark square (D.)
- With right sides together (RST), place a dark square (D) onto a light rectangle (B). See diagram 1.
- Sew on the pencil line and trim leaving a $1 / 4$ " seam allowance.
- Press to the dark. See diagram 2.
- Repeat, adding another dark square (D) onto the light rectangle (B) , sew and trim.. See diagram 3.
- Make a total of 20 flying geese units. Make these as scrappy as you like.

## Constructing Block 1

- Sew 4 C squares, 4 B/D flying geese block units, and 1 A square together into 3 rows. Press as indicated by arrows.
- Sew the rows together. See diagram 4.
- Press seams to row 2.
- Repeat for a total of 5 Block 1.

## Making the Flying Geese Units

- Using a pencil, draw a straight line from corner to corner on the wrong side of a light square (G).
- With right sides together (RST), place a light square (G) onto a dark rectangle (H). See diagram 5.
- Sew on the pencil line and trim leaving a $1 / 4$ " seam allowance.
- Press to the light. See diagram 6.
- Repeat, adding another light square (G) onto the light rectangle (H), sew and trim.. See diagram 7.
- Make a total of 16 flying geese units.

## Making the Half-square Triangles

- With a pencil, draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of a light square ( $F$ ).
- Place a light square (F) and a dark square (J) right sides together.
- Sew $1 / 4$ " on either side of the pencil line. See diagram 8.
- Cut on the pencil line. See diagram 9.
- Press to the dark. See diagram 10.
- Trim to $13 / 4$ " square.

Note: (1) F square + (1) J square $=(2) \mathrm{F} / \mathrm{J}$ half-square triangles.
Repeat for a total of (16) F/J half-square triangles.

## Making Side Units 1 and 2

- Using a pencil, draw a straight line from corner to corner on the wrong side of a dark square (K.)
- With right sides together (RST), place a dark square (K) onto a light rectangle (E). See diagram 11.
- Sew on the pencil line and trim leaving a $1 / 4$ " seam allowance.
- Press to the dark. See diagram 12.
- Make a total of 4 Side Unit 1.
- Repeat. See diagrams 13 and 14.
- Make a total of 4 Side Unit 2.

## Making the Left and Right Side Block Units

- Sew 2 F/J half-square triangles and 1 E/K side unit together. Press as indicated. See diagram 15. Make a total of 4 Left Side Block units. Make as scrappy as you like.
- Sew 2 F/J half-square triangles and 1 E/K side unit together. Press as indicated. See diagram 16. Make a total of 4 Right Side Block units. Make as scrappy as you like.

## Making the Center Flying Geese Units

- Sew 4 different G/H Flying Geese together. Press as indicated. See diagram 17. Make a total of 4 Center Flying Geese units. Make as scrappy as you like.

- Repeat for a total of 4 Block 2.

## Yardage Requirements

- 1 yard light print for pieced blocks and outside border
- 1/6 yard each of 4 different green prints for pieced blocks and inside border
- 1/8 yard green print for inside border
- 1/4 yard for binding
- 1 yard for backing
