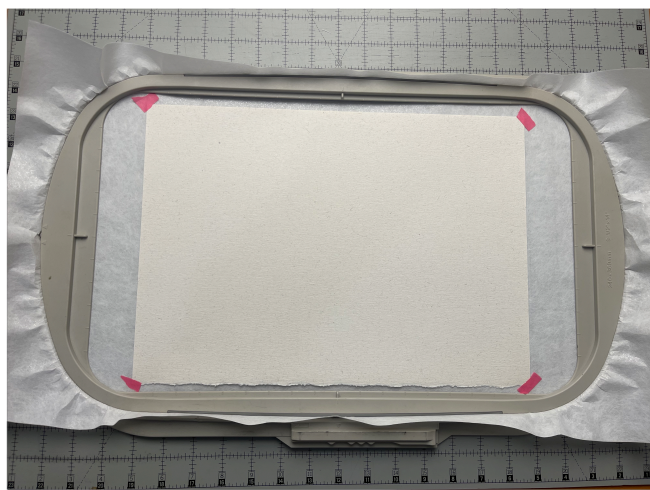


### Colouring Cards

Did you forget how much fun it is to colour? These designs are perfect to sew on water-colour paper and then colour with markers, pencils or paints. You need water-colour paper and Floriani Cutaway Medium or Power Mesh stabilizer.

Hoop one layer of Floriani Cutaway Medium and place a piece of water-colour paper on top. Use some RNK Embroidery Perfection tape in the corners to hold the paper in the centre of the hoop. Stitch an outline style embroidery design on to the paper. When it is complete you can trim the stabilizer from around the paper. We suggest the Quilters Select Rotary Cutter/Ruler to get a nice clean edge to your colouring card. If you stitched more than one colouring card on the same paper you can also rotary cut them into separate colouring cards.



This is all you need to do to make a colouring card however it is possible to add fabric to the back to make them a little more finished looking. You can also add RNK Deco Magic to the back to help add more structure plus adding something to the back cleans up the back and no one needs to know about any messes that happened on the bobbin side. :) You need to use a Fusible Cutaway stabilizer to be able to add other layers to the back. Trevor's favourite way to finish them is to fuse Deco Magic to the back and then use RNK Press 2 Bond to add a layer of Fabric to the back of the Deco Magic. All of that is optional because you can have just as much fun colouring them with nothing added to the back.









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
