Welcome to our In the Hoop projects. There are seven different projects included with three different tutorials. These designs are all created with a raw edge for a professional modern look. The fabric we chose to create these projects was ultra suede which is easy to work with, readily available and comes in beautiful colors and patterns. Since the projects have a raw edge you need to choose a fabric that won't fray. Leather, suede, vinyl, ultra-suede and some knits will work. You can use denim or other fabrics if you are going for a frayed edge look.

MEMO PAD COVER



Material List

Tearaway stabilizer - for jumbo hoop

Scotch tape

Base fabric - 2 pieces 4.25" x 12.75"

Pocket fabric - 2 pieces 4.25" x 5.5"

Thin Batting - 2 pieces 3" x 5 3/8"

Design Name - IH-DA2

Size 4.0" Wide - 11.6" High

Stitches 13375

Steps

Wind your bobbin to match your thread

1. *Placement stitch - place your batting and top fabric after this step.*

2. *Tacking stitch - tacks your batting and top fabric in place*

3. *Embroidery step- leaves*

4. *Embroidery step- flower*

5. *Embroidery Step - Flower Center*

6. *Embroidery step -leaves- place your back fabric and pockets after this step*

7. *Tacking stitch - tacks your back fabric and pockets in place*

8. *Finishing stitch*

BUSINESS CARD CASE



Material List

Tearaway stabilizer - for medium hoop

Scotch tape

Base fabric - 2 pieces 4.75" x 6"

Pocket fabric - 2 pieces 4.75" x 2"

Thin Batting - 2 pieces 3.5" x 2"

Design Name - IH-DA3

Size - 5.3" wide -5.0" high

Stitches - 6358

Steps

Wind your bobbin to match your thread

1. *Placement stitch* - place your batting and top fabric after this step.
2. *Tacking stitch* - tacks your batting and top fabric in place
3. *Embroidery step* - leaves
4. *Embroidery Step* - flowers
5. *Embroidery step* - leaves - place your back fabric and pockets after this step
6. *Tacking stitch* - tacks your back fabric and pockets in place
7. *Finishing stitch*



Material List

Tearaway stabilizer - for jumbo hoop

Scotch tape

Base fabric - 2 pieces 7.5" x 8.0"

Pocket fabric - 2 pieces 7.5" x 3.5"

Thin Batting - 2 pieces 3" x 6.25"

Size 7.0" wide - 6.5" high

Stitches 15885

Steps

Wind your bobbin to match your thread

1. *Placement stitch - place your batting and top fabric after this step.*
2. *Tacking stitch - tacks your batting and top fabric in place*
3. *Embroidery step - flowers*
4. *Embroidery Step - leaves*
5. *Embroidery Step - Flowers*
6. *Embroidery Step - Flower Center- place your back fabric and pockets after this step*
7. *Tacking stitch - tacks your back fabric and pockets in place*
8. *Finishing stitch*

CALENDAR COVER



Material List

Tearaway stabilizer - for jumbo hoop

Scotch tape

Base fabric - 2 pieces 7.75" x 8.75"

Pocket fabric - 2 pieces 7.75" x 3.75"

Thin Batting - 2 pieces 6 5/8" x 3 3/8"

Design Name - IH-DA4

Size 7.75" wide - 7.85" high

Stitches 15714

Steps

Wind your bobbin to match your thread

1. *Placement stitch* - place your batting and top fabric after this step.
2. *Tacking stitch* - tacks your batting and top fabric in place
3. *Embroidery step* - leaves
4. *Embroidery Step* - flowers
5. *Embroidery Step* - Flower Centers - place your back fabric and pockets after this step
6. *Tacking stitch* - tacks your back fabric and pockets in place
7. *Finishing stitch*

PAPERBACK COVER



Material List

Tearaway stabilizer - for jumbo hoop

Scotch tape

Base fabric - 2 pieces 8" x 11"

Pocket fabric - 2 pieces 8" x 4"

Thin Batting - 2 pieces 4" x 7"

Design Name - IH-DA5

Size 7.2" wide - 9.9" high

Stitches - 21569

Steps

Wind your bobbin to match your thread

1. *Placement stitch* - place your batting and top fabric after this step.
2. *Tacking stitch* - tacks your batting and top fabric in place
3. *Embroidery step* - leaves
4. *Embroidery step* - flowers
5. *Embroidery step* - flower centers
6. *Embroidery step* - leaves - place your back fabric and pockets after this step
7. *Tacking stitch* - tacks your back fabric and pockets in place
8. *Finishing stitch*

COVER TUTORIAL

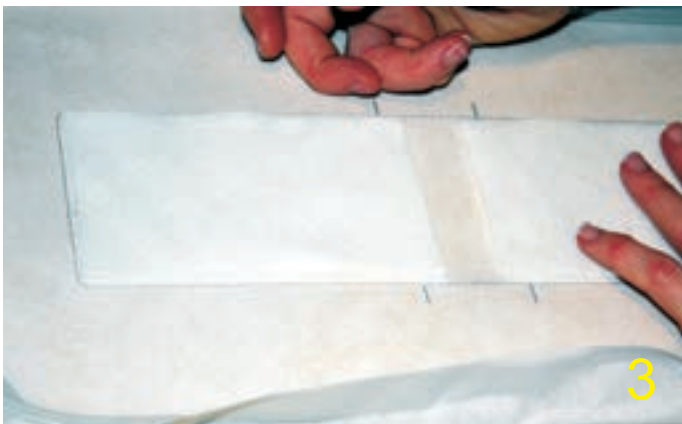
All of the covers use this tutorial. The shapes may differ but the process to create them is exactly the same. The materials and sizes of fabric you need are listed on each designs main page.



The first step is to hoop a piece of tear-away stabilizer. Try to use a stabilizer that will tear away very cleanly.



Embroider step one in the design. This is your placement stitch. You will also notice four lines that either extend outside the box or inside it. We will use these marks later.



Place your two pieces of batting inside the lines as close as you can to the edges. You will place them towards the outside of the box. You will notice a gap in the middle. This gap is essential, it will allow your cover to fold easily.



Next place your main fabric piece down so that it completely covers the placement stitch. Be careful not to disturb the batting, we recommends slowly rolling the fabric into place.



Once the fabric is in place use scotch tape to secure it to the stabilizer. You don't need to worry about the tape ruining the fabric. The part of the fabric it is secure to will be cut away later.

COVER TUTORIAL



Embroider step 2 of the design. This stitch will tack your fabric in place.



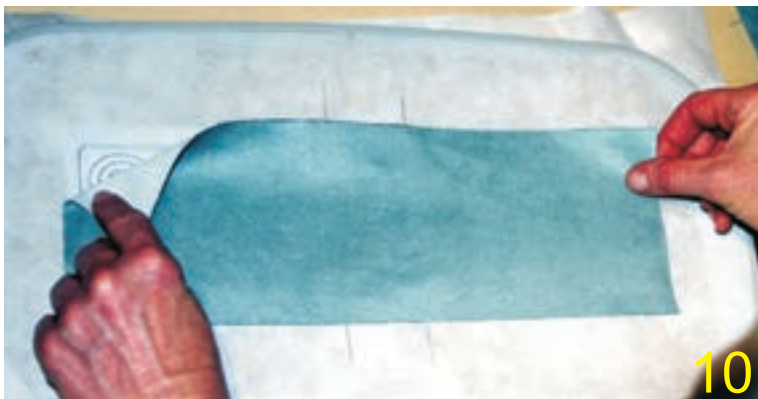
The next step or steps will complete the embroidery portion of the design. (Each design set will differ, check the design page for the actual amount of color steps in the embroidery portion.)



This photo shows you the embroidery complete.



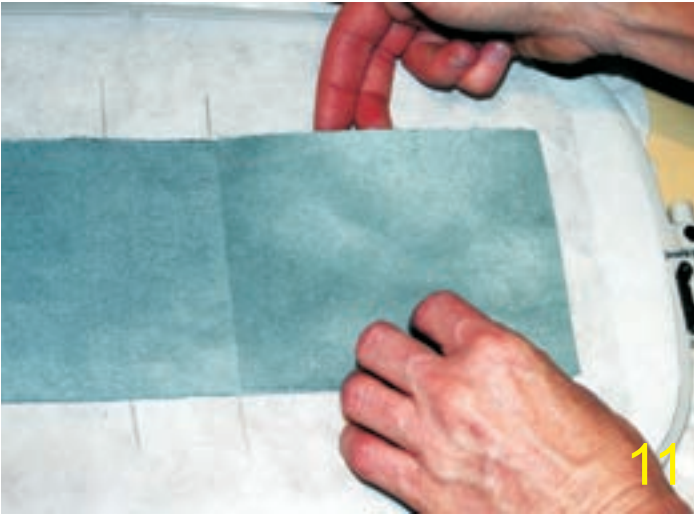
After the embroidery steps are complete remove the hoop from the machine and turn it over on a flat surface. Remember those lines that embroidered during the first step? Use a pencil to extend them further out into the hoop. They are actually a guide stitch that will show you where to place your pockets.



Lay your back fabric down with the decorative side facing up so that it completely covers the guide stitch. Make sure you can view the pencil lines.

This tutorial only shows 1 embroidery step. Please refer to the project sheets for this collections actual steps.

COVER TUTORIAL



Place the pockets so that one side is even with the pencil lines and the other side is flush with your back fabric.



Tape the pockets and back piece down the same way that you did the front. Make sure you place a piece of tape over each pocket seam at the inside corners (shown above) this will prevent the pocket from rolling over when it is tacked down.



Once everything is taped in place turn your hoop over and press down. This will further adhere the tape without losing tension in the hoop. Next, return the hoop to the machine.



Embroider the next step in the design. This will tack the back piece and the pocket in place.



Remove the hoop from the machine and turn over. Inspect the pockets and back piece to make sure they are properly in place. If they did not tack down properly you will have to pick out the last step and try again.

COVER TUTORIAL



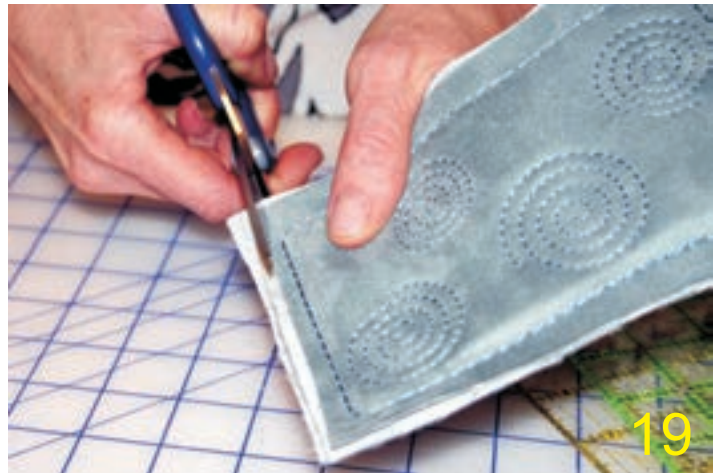
Return the hoop to the machine and embroider the final step. The final step is a finishing 5-ply running stitch. This step also stitches your folding seams.



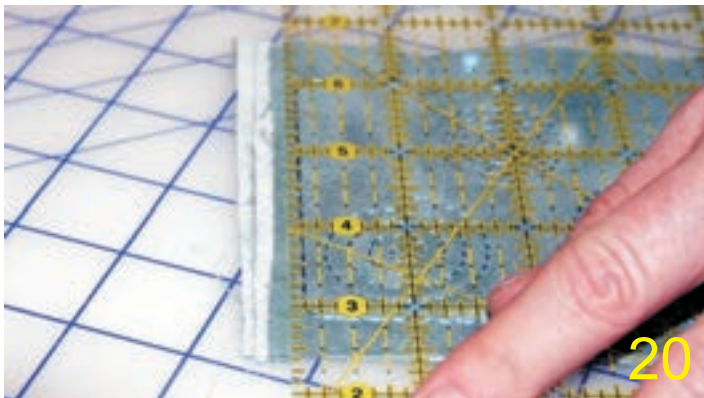
Remove the hoop from the machine and carefully remove all of the tape.



Remove the stabilizer by tugging away from the seam instead of tearing. This will get rid of almost all of the stabilizer.



If you have a steady hand you can trim the edges with a pair of scissors. How close do you trim? If you want a smooth edge, about 1/8 of an inch. If you are going for a distressed edge because you are using denim or a fabric that you want to fray, a wider edge will work fine.



We prefer to trim with a rotary cutter and a clear ruler. Simply line up the ruler so that the stitched line is on the 1/8 mark on your ruler.

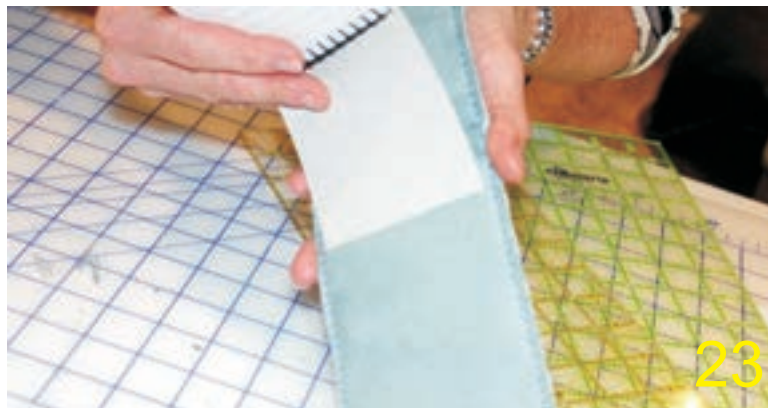
COVER TUTORIAL



Press firmly and use your rotary cutter to cut away the excess material. You may need to make more than one pass with the rotary cutter.



Use scissors to snip the corners.



Slide your memo pad, checkbook, book, calender or business cards into the cover!



You're finished!

ZIPPERED BAG



Material List

Tearaway stabilizer 2 pieces for the 5"x7" hoop

Scotch tape

1 piece of ultra-suede - 7" x 5.5"

1 piece of ultra-suede - 7" x 1.5"

1 piece of ultra-suede - 7" x 4.0"

1 Coil or polyester zipper no metal teeth! at least 9" in length

Design Name - IH-DA6A

Size 5.6" Wide - 6.0" High

Stitches 8169

Steps

Wind your bobbin to match your thread

1. Placement stitch - place your top fabric after this step.
2. Embroidery step - leaves
3. Embroidery step - flowers
4. Embroidery step - flower centers
5. Embroidery step - leaves
6. Guide stitch - defines the shape of the bag

Design Name - IH-DA6B

Size 5.6" Wide - 6.3" High

Stitches 6441

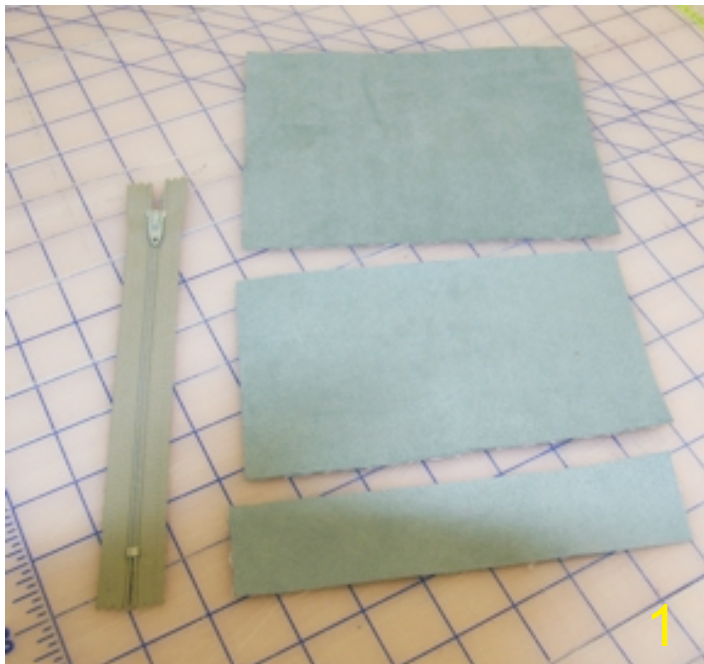
Steps

Wind your bobbin to match your thread

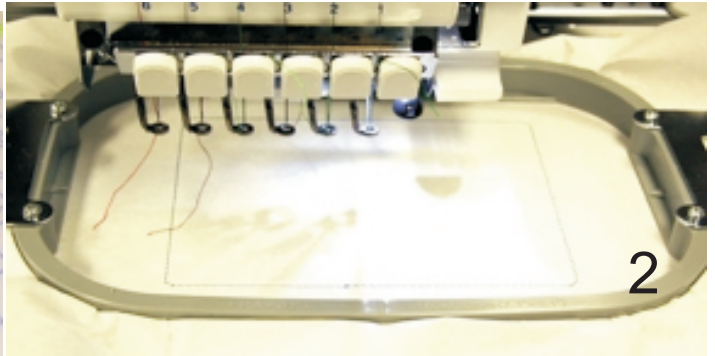
1. Placement stitch - place your zipper and top fabric after this step.
2. Zipper tacking stitch
3. Embroidery step - leaves
4. Embroidery step - flowers
5. Embroidery step - flower center
6. Embroidery step - leaves
7. Guide stitch - defines the shape of the bag - place your second piece of fabric down after step 4
- 8 Tacking stitch - stitches both pieces together

ZIPPERED BAG TUTORIAL

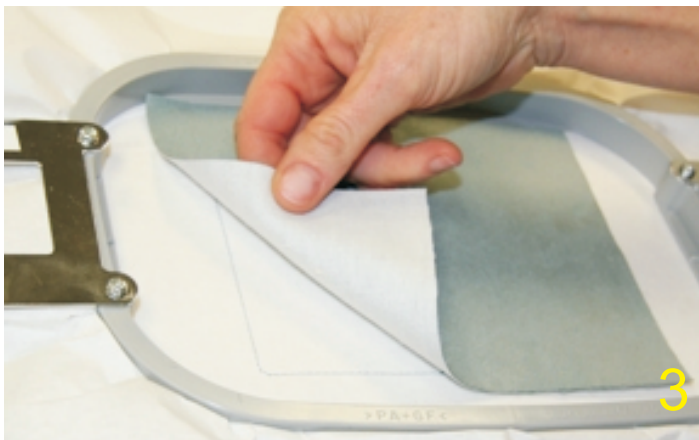
This is an easy in the hoop project. For this project we are using ultra-suede. Since there are raw edges in the project you will want to use a fabric that won't fray.



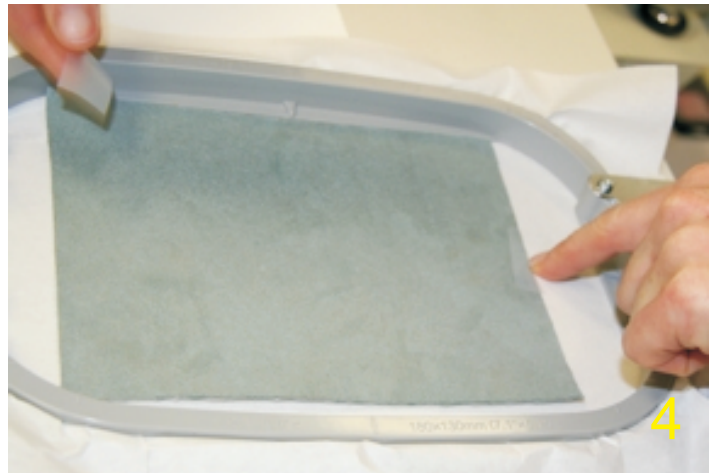
The first step is to assemble all of the pieces from the material list.



Hoop your first piece of tearaway stabilizer and embroider step one of the first design (The design ending with an A is the first design). This is a placement stitch for your large piece of fabric.



After step one embroiders lay your large piece of fabric down decorative side up so that it completely covers the stitch.



Once it is in place use tape to secure it to the stabilizer.

ZIPPERED BAG TUTORIAL



Embroider the next step. This is the embroidery portion of the design (Some designs may have more than one embroidery step, check your design sheet).



Next, embroider the next step in the design. This will be your guide stitch in the shape of the bag.



Remove the design from the hoop and remove all stabilizer.



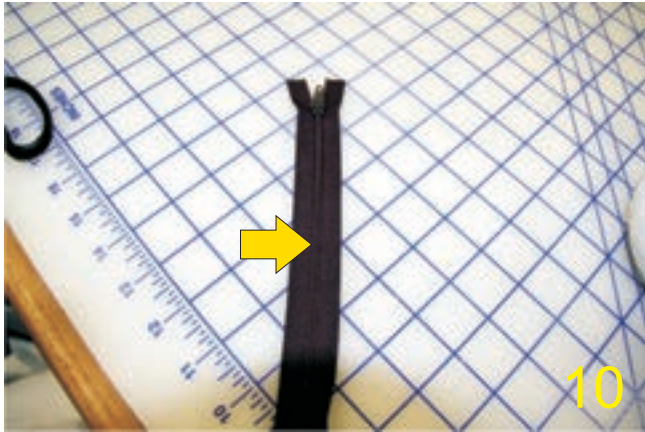
Tightly hoop a piece of tear-away stabilizer.



Embroider step one of the "B" design. This is the zipper placement line. Notice the lines extended past the center line, you are going to use them later to line up your fabric pieces.

ZIPPERED BAG TUTORIAL



The center of the zipper is very important, when you place the zipper you need to make sure that the zipper's teeth line up exactly on the placement line.



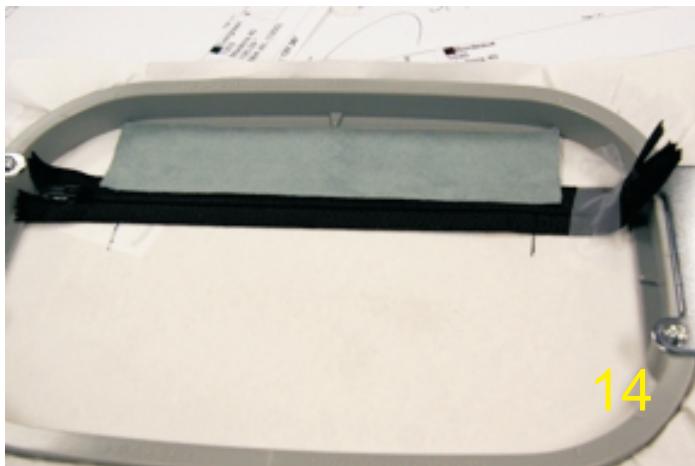
Remove the hoop from the machine and lightly spray temporary spray adhesive down the placement line.



Stick the zipper down so that the center of the zipper falls **right on the line** and make sure it extends past both fabric placement lines.



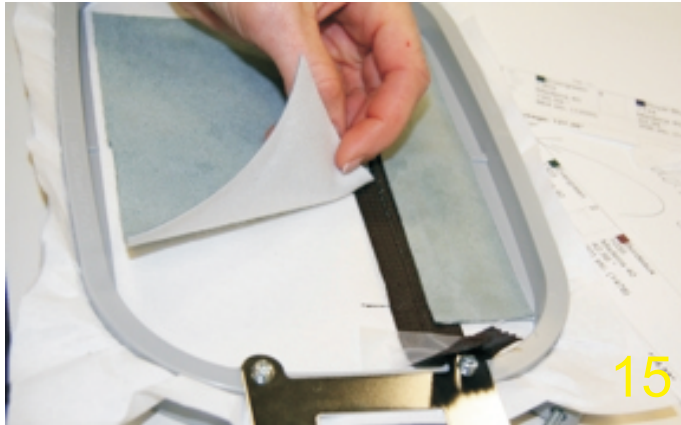
While the hoop is still out of the machine spray the adhesive along both sides of the zipper.



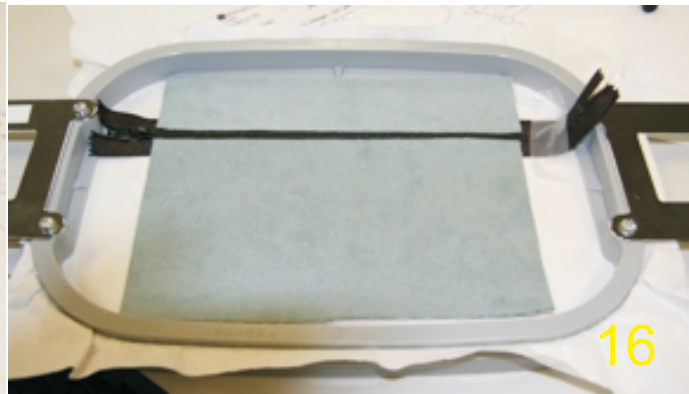
Next, lay your smallest piece of fabric to the left of the zipper. Make sure the fabric extends past the fabric placement lines. The suede has a perfectly straight edge, place the edge so that it is almost touching the coils. Leave enough room for the zipper to be unzipped.

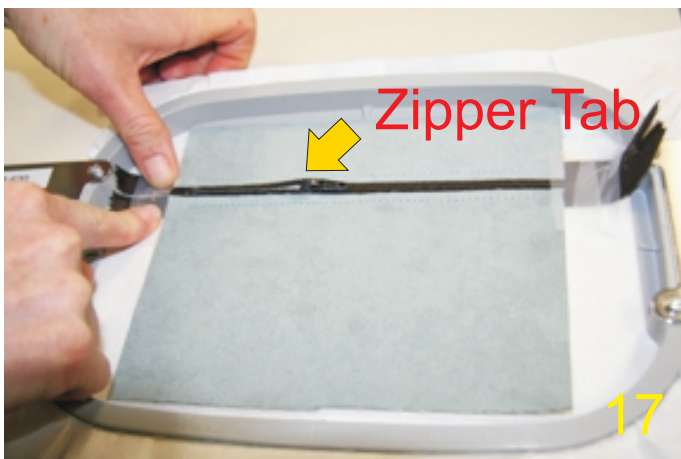
ZIPPERED BAG TUTORIAL



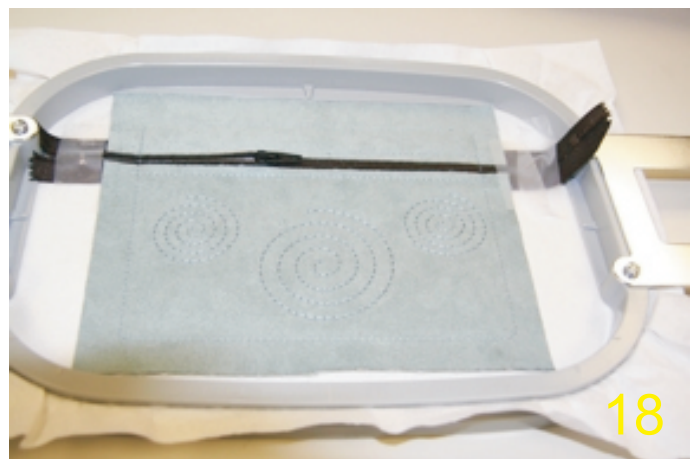
Now lay your medium sized piece of fabric along the other side of the zipper using the same techniques.



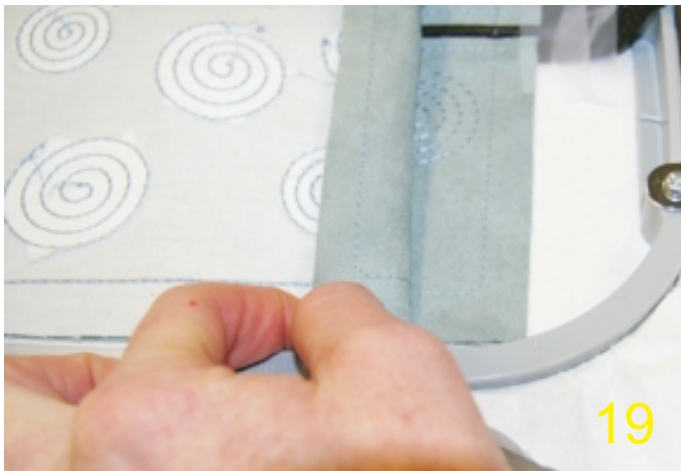
This is what your bag should look like so far.



Return the hoop to the machine and embroider step two. This step will stitch the first two pieces of fabric down. **After the lines stitch down, slide your zipper tab down so that it falls in the middle of the bag.**



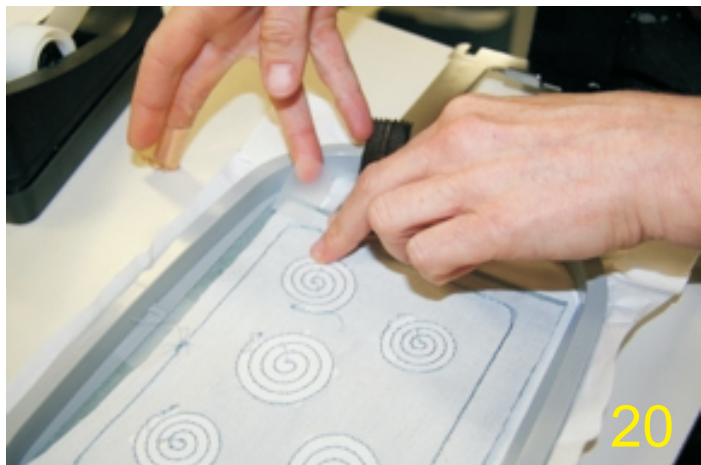
Return the hoop to the machine and stitch the next 2 steps. Step 3 is the embroidery portion of the design. (depending on the design there may be more than 1 step for embroidery). Step 4 is an outline stitch that will define the shape of the bag.



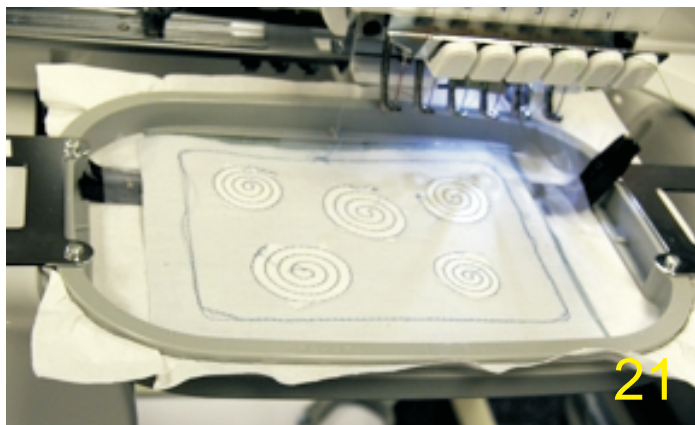
Remove the hoop from the machine and lay it on a flat surface. Now take the piece that you previously embroidered and lay it face down over the design that is in the hoop. Line up the guidelines so that piece one is evenly over piece 2.

ZIPPERED BAG TUTORIAL



Tape the piece in place.



Return the hoop to the machine and embroider the final step. This step stitches both sides of the bag together.



Remove the design from the hoop and remove all of the stabilizer.



Make sure you remove the stabilizer that is covering the zipper tab. You will not be able to turn the bag inside out without it.



Use a pair of scissors to trim all the way around the bag. You should have no problem cutting through the zipper.

ZIPPERED BAG TUTORIAL



Slide the zipper out of the way and turn the bag inside out.



You're finished!

PURSE



Material List

Tearaway stabilizer - for jumbo hoop 2 pieces

Scotch tape

Back Fabric - 7 3/4" x 12 1/2"

Inside Fabric (Flap) - 6 3/4" x 7 3/4"

Inside Fabric (Body) - 5 1/2" x 7 3/4"

Pocket - 5" x 7 3/4"

Nylon or plastic zipper at least 9" in Length

Design Name - IH-DA7A

Size 6.7 Wide - 11.3" High

Stitches 19859

Steps

Wind your bobbin to match your thread

1. *Placement stitch - place your large piece of fabric after this step.*
2. *Embroidery step - leaves*
3. *Embroidery step - flowers*
4. *Embroidery step - flower center*
5. *Embroidery Step - leaves*
6. *Guide stitch*

Design Name - IH-DA7B

Size 6.7" Wide - 11.3" High

Stitches 2944

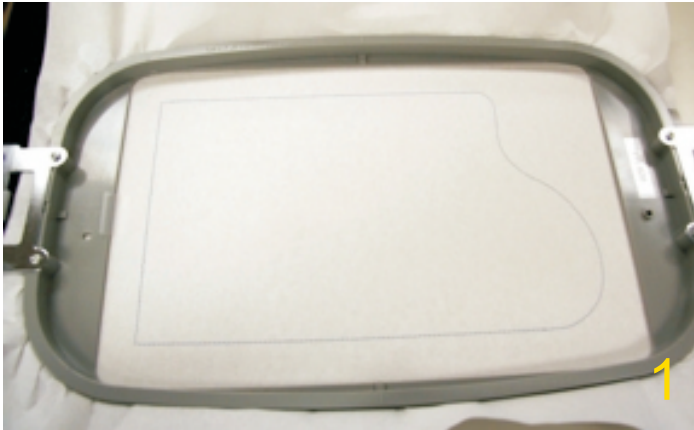
Steps

Wind your bobbin to match your thread

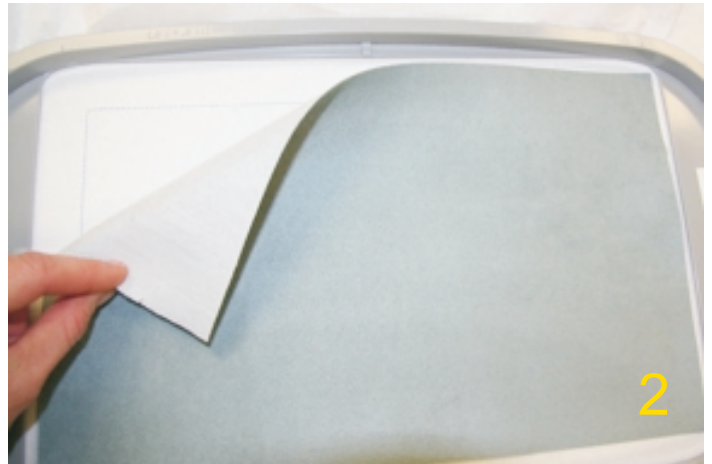
1. *Zipper and fabric alignment stitch - place your zipper and the flap and body pieces after this step.*
2. *Zipper tacking stitch - secures your zipper - slide zipper to center after this step.*
3. *Tacking stitch - tacks fabric and zipper in place, place your pocket after this step.*
4. *pocket tacking stitch - place your back fabric on after this step.*
5. *alignment stitch - check to see that your back fabric is aligned after this step*
6. *Finishing stitch.*

PURSE TUTORIAL

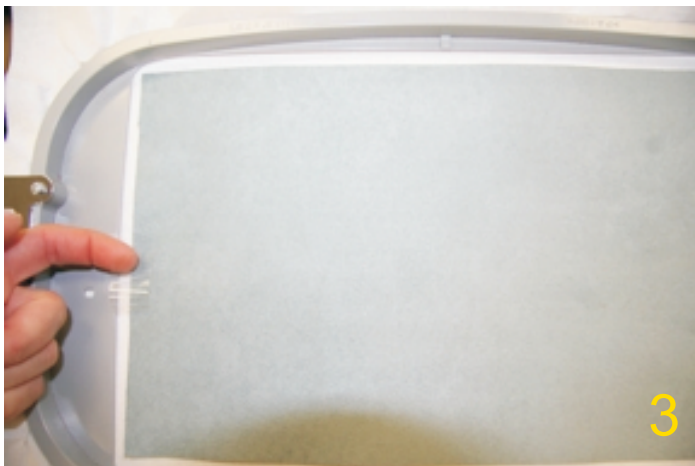
The purse is created with two different designs. Part A is the back of the purse and front of the flap when it's folded over. Design B is the inside of the purse, pocket and finishing stitches. Here is what to do first.



Open design IH-CA7A in your machine. Hoop a piece of tearaway stabilizer and embroider step 1.



Remove the hoop from the machine and place your large piece of fabric decorative side up so that it completely covers the guide stitch.



Tape the fabric in place along the edges so it doesn't shift.



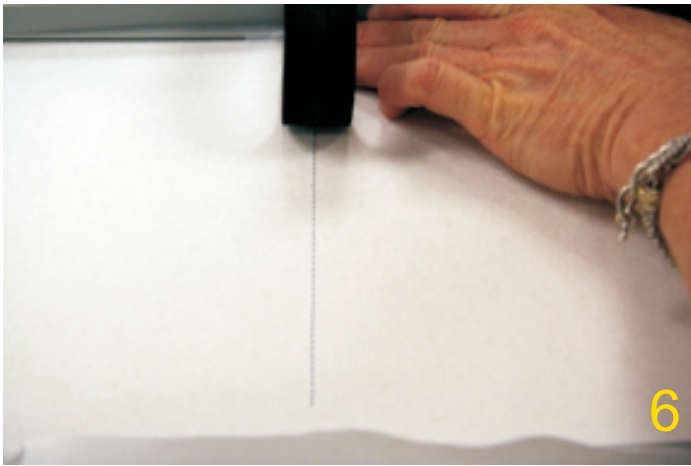
Embroider the next step. This is your embroidery design (some designs may have more than one embroidery step). After the embroidery is finished, stitch the next step. This is an alignment stitch that runs along the bottom of the back. You will use this later to line up your pieces.



Remove the design from the hoop, remove all stabilizer and set aside for now.

PURSE TUTORIAL



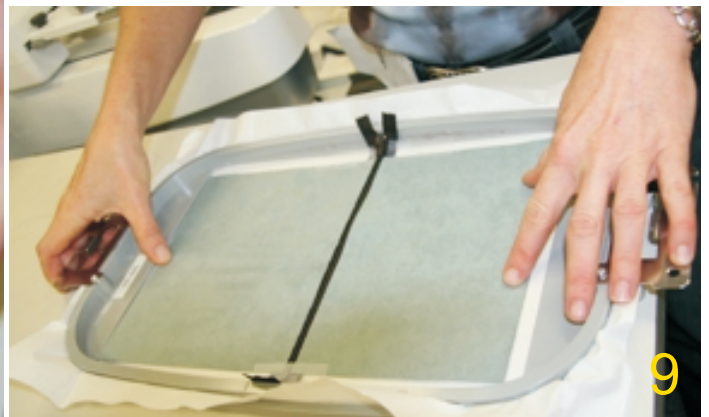
Open design IH-CA7B in your machine. Hoop a piece of tearaway stabilizer and embroider step 1. This is the placement line for your zipper. Roll your zipper in place so that the center of the teeth falls right on the stitched line.



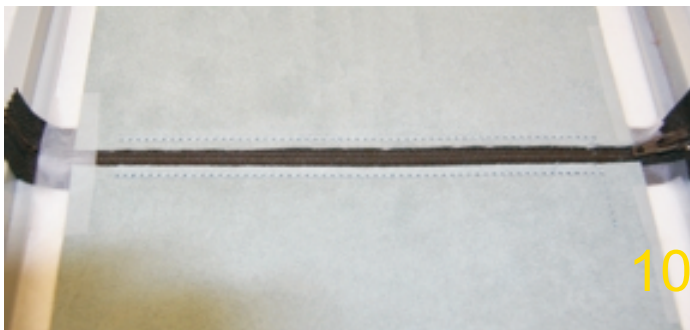
Tape the zipper in place along both sides.



This is a close up of the way we tape the zipper in place.



Next, you are going to place your two pieces of fabric. If you are using a standard machine the FLAP piece gets placed above the zipper and the BODY piece below it. Once the pieces are in place tape them into place.



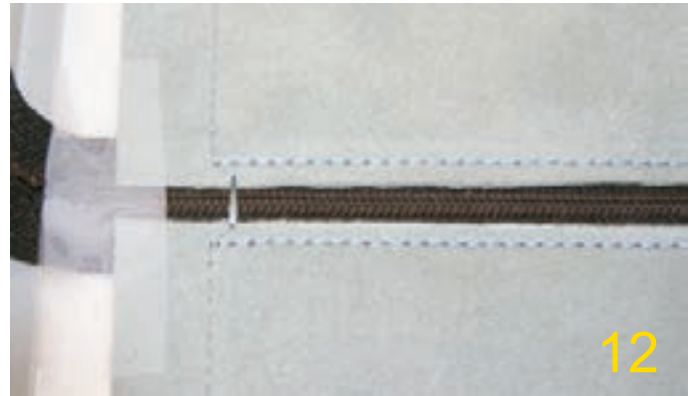
Embroider step 2 of the design. This stitch tacks your zipper into place.

This tutorial only shows 1 embroidery step. Please refer to the project sheets for this collections actual steps.

PURSE TUTORIAL



This important!! After step two slide the zipper tab towards the middle. This will insure the zipper tab will be inside the purse.



Embroider step 3. This step tacks all of the fabric down and locks down the edges of the zipper.



This is what your design will look like so far. Now its time to place the pocket piece.



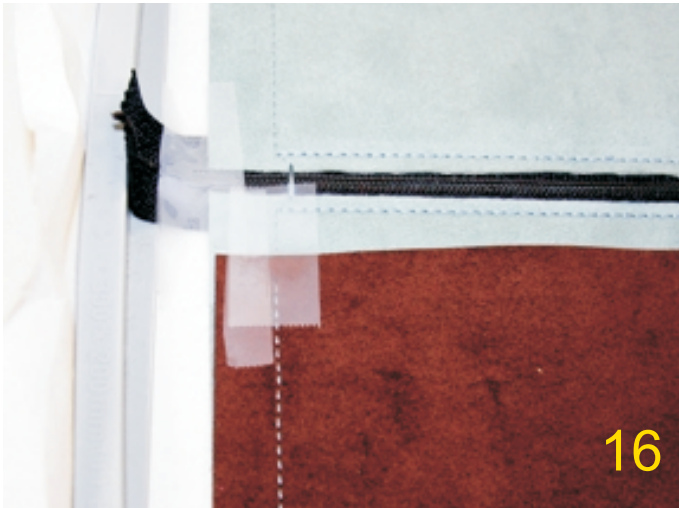
Place your pocket piece at the bottom, lining up the bottom edges with your body piece.



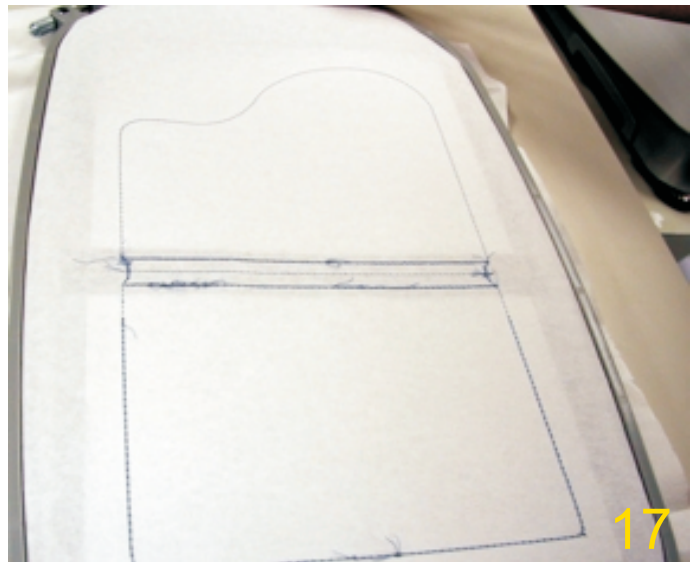
Now tape the pocket into place.

This tutorial only shows 1 embroidery step. Please refer to the project sheets for this collections actual steps.

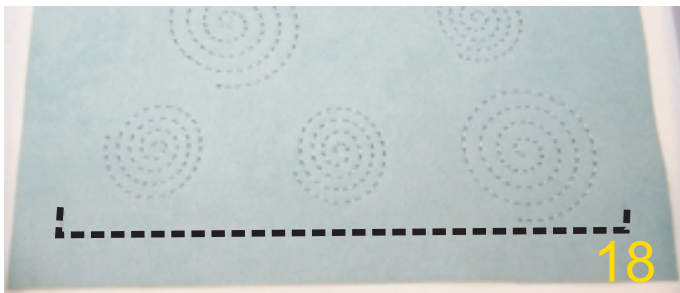
PURSE TUTORIAL



Place a piece of tape over the seam. This will prevent your foot from lifting the edge. Embroider step 4. This stitch will lock the pocket in place.



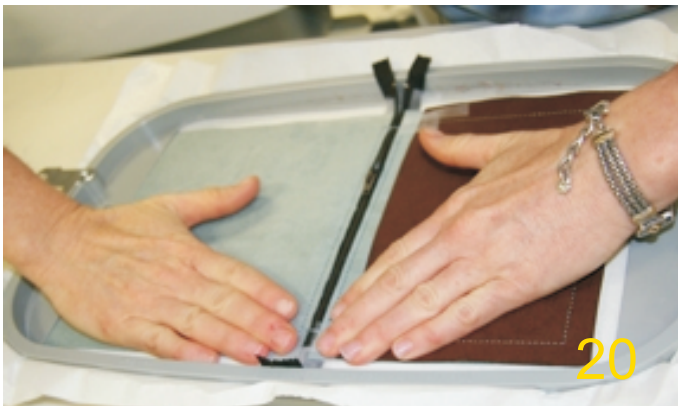
Remove the hoop from the machine and turn it over.



Retrieve your back piece. Remember the lines at the bottom?



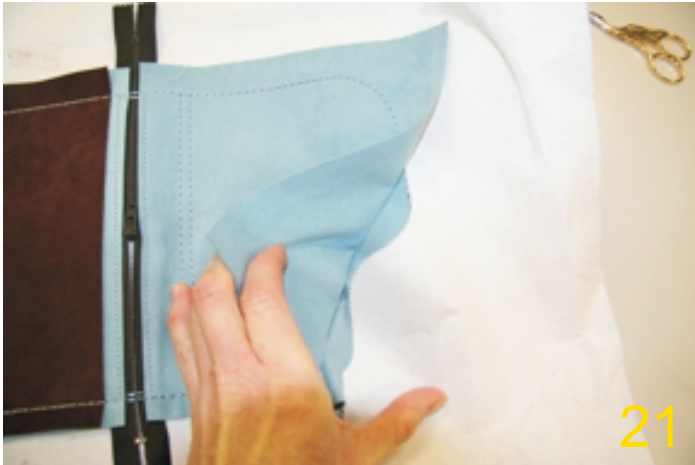
Place your back fabric over the outline stitch visible from the back of the hoop so that your alignment line on the back piece matches up with the outline. Now, tape the back piece in place.



Turn the hoop over and press down. This will adhere the tape with messing up your hoop tension. Now embroider the next two steps. Step five is a tack stitch. Remove the hoop after step 5 and check the back to make sure your back piece stitched correctly. Step 6 is your finishing stitch.

This tutorial only shows 1 embroidery step. Please refer to the project sheets for this collections actual steps.

PURSE TUTORIAL



Remove the design from the machine. You are finished with the embroidery. Now remove the stabilizer. Remove it by pulling from the seam, this will insure a cleaner tear.

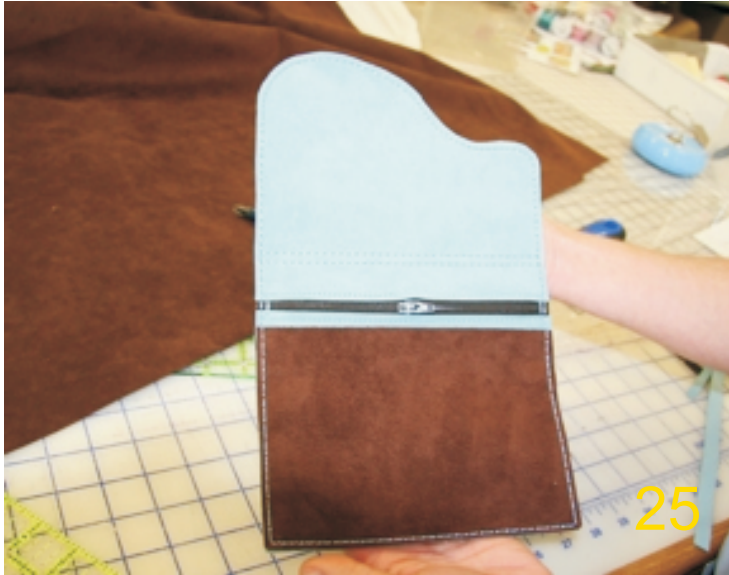


This picture shows the finished project!



Trim away the excess fabric carefully around the edges. You want to leave a 1/8" border around the outside edge.

Here is the project so far. One more step to go.



Unzip the zipper and remove any excess stabilizer from the inside of the bag. That's all there is to it!



The finished purse

Tips

1. Feel free to add a strap or handle to customize the project. You can use ultra suede for this too.
2. Experiment with colors, we used two colors for our bag, you can use up to 4 if you desire.
3. You can also experiment with closures. Add a snap, magnetic closure or velcro under the flap!
