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

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NON-SLIP 12" Wave Ruler


The 12" Wave Ruler cuts away excess fabric from any block with a finished width of 12" to add a wave. Use the ruler to also cut the sashing strips that will be sewn back into the block.


Assembly Example: Multiple Wave Blocks Sewn Together




Cutout Line 1


Center and place the 12"Wave Ruler Cutout 1 Line on one 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ " edge of a stack of blocks. Cut away the fabric on the concave edge of the ruler. Or, cut both sides to create an hour-glass block with two concave edges.










Cutout Line 1

Center and place the 12" Wave Ruler Cutout 2 Line on one 12 ½" edge of a stack of blocks. Cut away the fabric on the convex edge of the ruler to create a block that looks like a wave. Or, cut both sides to create a pear shaped block with two convex edges.






Cutting The Wavy Sashing Strips

Step 1: Cut a 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x Width of Fabric strip, then use the 12" Wave Ruler to cut the "waves" by cutting on both sides of the ruler.

Step 2: Stack the cut pieces and position the ruler on top. Trim the smart corners on each sashing piece for easy assembly.




Assembly Hints

These cut waves can be inserted to create a wavy border as shown. To see more options, visit Quiltworx.com, Notions, and find the 12"Wave Ruler. Sew the blocks together using your favorite curved piecing method. Then press the seams toward the sashing strip.

The ruler includes TRP lines (transition or registration points). Use these lines to mark the location of match points on the curved seams to sew a perfect seam! Mark them with a water soluble pen or baste at each location.
