### **Fabric/Supplies needed:**

Fat Quarter or 1/4 yard of quilting cotton or canvas for Hat Body (may need more if fabric is directional)

WOF x 6" strip of quilting cotton for Lining Trim, Ponytail Hole Binding, Sweatband and Closure "Bead" wrap  
(can also purchase 1" wide bias tape for the Lining Trim)

10" long 1mm wide elastic cording

1/2 yard of Pellon SF101 Shape-flex for Hat Body (20" width)

Scrap piece at least 6" x 9" of Pellon Peltex 70

5/16" Metal washer or large bead with opening at least 2mm wide

3/16" Barrel Cord Lock

Permanent fabric glue if using metal washer for bead

Fabric marking pen or pencil

Fabric scissors

Pinking shears

Snips

Seam ripper

Stiletto (optional)

Pins

Iron and ironing board

Sewing Machine

Top and bobbin thread for sewing machine

**By the Way: It is important to have all your materials before class begins and have your sewing machine set up and ready to sew. Our teachers make every effort to start on time and we want you to get full benefit of the class experience.**
