## Embroidery Supply List:

15 yards Heavy Weight Tear Away (Pellon \#806 Stitch \& Tear )
Temporary Adhesive Spray: Suggested 505 Spray Adhesive
Removable fabric marking pen (No air erasable pens) SewLine Duo Marker, medium tip recommended
Mechanical Chalk Pencil (to mark center if darker fabric is used for sky test on fabric for removal)
Needles 80/12 and 90/14 Sharps (both work but some machines prefer one over the other)
Terial Magic Starch (mandatory)
Basic embroidery kit including small double curved scissors, tweezers, Jumbo Wonder Clips,
Arrow shaped post it notes by Post-It-Notes (they say: SIGN here)

## Sewing Supply List

50wt. Cotton Thread matching the fabric for piecing.
Basic sewing kit including Double Curve Embroidery scissors ( Kai 5" Double Curve recommended), pins, rotary cutter \& mat, long straight ruler, etc.
$201 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Square Ruler by Creative Grids for accurate marking \& trimming (recommended)
Foot Petal \& straight stitch foot (sewing Center Sky to Background Fabric), embroidery foot \& cords.

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## Class Prep: Cutting Instructions for Background \& Sky Fabric

Background Fabric: ( $11 / 2$ yards $=54$ ")
Cut (1) 44 " square (or cut a square using the width of your fabric 44 " plus)

Sky Fabric: (22"square)
Cut (1) 22" square

## Fabric Preparation

## Starch the fabric: Terial Magic.

Saturate the Background \& Sky Fabric in Terial Magic. This product is a heavy starch. The fabric must be very stiff to avoid stretching during embroidery. Let the fabric almost dry then iron the fabric flat and smooth.

Interfacing: Shape Flex 101 by Pellon (woven) or Fusible Woven by OESD Center and Iron interfacing (after Terial Magic) adhesive side down, to the back of the 44" Background Square \& the 22" Sky Fabric Square. Piece the interfacing to get the size needed. Over lap the pieced sections by $1 / 2 "$. The interfacing may be slightly smaller than the fabric blocks \& it will shrink more when you iron it. Lightly spray with water to activate the adhesive. Smooth the interfacing with your hands (this will help to displace the air between the interfacing \& fabric).
Start pressing in the center and work out slowly. Iron the interfacing to the fabric.
All edges should be sealed together. If you see air bubbles, spray with water and iron again.

## Marking Instructions



Mark the Fabric: (use removable ink)
On the front side of the Background and Sky Fabrics mark a horizontal \& vertical line, the full LENGTH \& WIDTH of the fabric, centered on the fabric (aka=center crosshair / shown in red)
Use a $201 / 2 "$ square ruler to mark the lines to ensure a $90^{\circ}$ center. See instructional video for example. claudiascreationsaz.com / videos / Marking Fabric
Sky Fabric marking is complete, (only needs the Center Crosshair marking) set aside.

## 44" Background Fabric:

Use a 6" x 24" Ruler:
Mark lines the full width and length of fabric.
Mark Vertical lines 6" \& 12" on both sides of the Center Vertical Line. Mark Horizontal lines 6" \& 12" above \& below the Center Horizontal Line.

The lines form a grid.
Lines must be parallel \& perpendicular to each other ( $90^{\circ}$ angle).

Write the words "Top of the Fabric" at the top of the fabric.
See picture. Also write Bottom, Left, \& Right in the appropriate locations.


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## Class Prep: Blue Sky Appliqué Paper Template Instructions

## Open \#7 Sky Template folder Print the Paper Template Pattern from the pdf file.

They will be 4 pages.
Tape the sections together matching the numbers in the outer corners. One page will be on top of the other, over lapping by $1 / 4$ " or so with the numbers on top of each other.


Page 2


The taped together paper template measures $141 / 2 "-15$ " at widest \& highest points. Measure your pattern and adjust if needed.

Diagram shows the horizontal widest points!
Make sure the vertical \& horizontal points are the same measurement. i.e.
$141 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ vertical \& horizontal or 15 " vertical \& horizontal

## Paper Template

## Optional:

Trace the pattern onto to a large piece of Heavy Weight tear away stabilizer: Include the grid markings \& words Top, Bottom, Left \& Right.
(The stabilizer is thicker than the computer paper and easier to trace around.)

Cut the paper pattern out following the outer lines on the template. Don't cut the outer lines off just cut to the outer edge of the lines.


* DO NOT CUT the Blue Fabric Square or the Polymesh to the template shape prior to class!! We will embroider on the full square piece of fabric in class then cut the shape out!


## Class Prep: Cutting \& Prep for Bunting Border Fabric

White Bunting Fabric (1 $1 / 8$ yard $=401 / 2$ ) :
Bring 3-4 of these pieces to class.

## Starch the fabric with Terial Magic.

Saturate the background fabric in Terial Magic.
This product is a heavy starch. The fabric must be very stiff to avoid stretching during embroidery. Let the fabric almost dry then iron the fabric flat and smooth.

Cut the prepared fabric into (5) 6" wide strips.
Sub cut each strip into 14 "cuts (or fold into thirds).

You will have 15 sections for the Bunting Border.
6 " wide $\times 14$ " high ( 2 will be extra bunting sections)
The remaining prepared fabric is for the
Appliqué Stars, set aside.

## Extra Class Prep Optional: <br> Prep and Cutting for Outer Navy Borders \& Red and White Strip

The borders will not be needed in class, but for those who like to get all the cutting and more prep done ahead of time, or at the same time, this is for you!
READ before cutting:
Interface the fabric with Shape Flex
See page 5 for instructions
Navy Blue Fabric (1 $1 / 2$ yards $=54 \prime \prime$ ):
51/2" $\times$ Length of Fabric
Cut (3) $51 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ LOF (length of fabric $=54 "$ ) strips of Navy Blue
Set (2) strips aside

Take (1) strip of Navy Blue Fabric, fold in half with right sides together. Cut the folded edge at a $45^{\circ}$ angle.


Lay the two strips side by side
Two strips with $45^{\circ}$ angle end cuts

When you interface the border strips it gives the same "weight" to the outside edge of the quilt top as the center weight of the quilt top!

## Optional Class Prep: Red \& White Pieced Striped Borders

Interfacing: Shape Flex 101 by Pellon (woven) or Fusible Woven by OESD Interface the Red \& White $1 / 3$ yd pieces of fabric prior to cutting.

White \& Red Fabric (1/3 Yard)
Cut (4) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF (width of fabric) strips of White
Cut (4) $2 \frac{1}{2} /{ }^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF (width of fabric) strips of Red
Set (1) strip of each color aside


Cut the 3 strips in half (6 strips of each color)

Side Vertical


Bottom Horizontal


Use $1 / 4$ " seam allowance.
Using 3 Red \& 3 White Strips sew together, staggering the starts by $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Using the other 3 Red \& 3 White strips stagger in the opposite direction. Press the seams to the red strips.

Lay the strips on the cutting mat. Lay a $24^{\prime \prime}$ ruler on the strip.
Align the $45^{\circ}$ angle of one strip to the $45^{\circ}$ mark on the ruler.
Get as close to the staggered edge as possible.

1. Cut one staggered end at a $45^{\circ}$ angle (see Example 1)
2. Cut (2) $5 \frac{1}{2}{ }^{\prime \prime}$ wide strips from each set (see Example 2).
3. Sew the short ends together to make one long strip (see Example 3).

Repeat this process with the other set.
