Fabric/Supplies needed:

Fabric Width	Size	Yardage needed
45" wide	XS-M	1 2/3 yards
	L-XXL	1 3/4 yards
60" wide	XS-M	1 yard
	L-XXL	1 1/2 yards

Bring to class:

- Basic sewing kit to include: fabric scissors, straight pins, marking pencil, seam ripper, seam guide, tape measure, thread clipping scissors
- Sewing machine in good working order with a new needle, power cord and foot control
- Optional: Serger for seam finishing
- Sewing thread to match or coordinate with fabric
- Knit stay tape

Pre Class Preparation:

- Determine size and trace pattern-Swedish tracing paper (my favorite)
- Pin pattern onto fabric but do not cut unless you have experience with knit fabric

By the Way: It is important to have all your materials before class begins and have your sewing machine set up and ready to sew. Our teachers make every effort to start on time and we want you to get full benefit of the class experience.
